SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.


CONFIRMATION—Those who have not been confirmed should call the Parish Office to receive further information.

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 13, 2015 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 50:5-a Psalm 116:1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 James 2:14-18 Mark 8:27-35

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus and his disciples set out for the villages of Caesarea Philippi. Along the way he asked his disciples, "Who do people say that I am?" They said in reply, "John the Baptist, others Elijah, still others one of the prophets." And he asked them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter said to him in reply, "You are the Christ." Then he warned them not to tell anyone about him.

He began to teach them that the Son of Man must suffer greatly and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and rise after three days. He spoke this openly. Then Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. At this he turned around and, looking at his disciples, rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan. You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do." He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me. For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake and that of the gospel will save it"

- 2. What do you have to do to cultivate your relationship with Jesus?
- 3. What needs to change in you to see with Jesus' eyes, to love with Jesus' heart?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A patient limped into the doctor's office. The doctor handed him a large pill. Just then his nurse interrupted to ask him some questions. While the doctor was answering her questions, the patient limped over to the sink and chocked down the pill. Then the doctor returned with a bucket and said "Now drop the pill in the bucket and we'll soak your foot." All pills are not the same. Each has its own application.

If we are not aware of ourselves we can easily be carried away by habits and customs, routines and regularities. We will lose our uniqueness and settle down to the 'usuals' as the norm of life.

In this week's Gospel story Jesus takes the deaf man away from the crowd and opens his ears by saying 'Be opened.' The deaf man began to hear and speak plainly. Whenever God-experience happens it opens a new faculty in us. We begin to sense something new that we have never sensed before. The touch of Jesus allows us to grasp things in a newer depth. He enables us to sense the formal and regular in a deeper and richer way.

We need to get away from our own habitual and customary ways of grasping reality so that Jesus can utter the words to us 'Be opened'; those words will open our senses to a new wave length of hearing, a new vision of seeing and a real way of experiencing the truth for what it is. Let us move away from what we have conveniently settled for. Let Jesus open our senses to the reality of things and persons, in the light and power of his words.

"Dare to Believe":

A Long Island, NY, high school student was denied permission to form a faith-based club on campus. However, days after Liberty Institute attorneys sent a demand letter challenging the principal's wrongful rejection, school officials announced their intention to follow the laws that guarantee the right of student religious groups - like "Dare to Believe" - to meet on campus as an official student club.

"It took a lot of courage for a 15 year old girl to come forward when her principal said Christian clubs are illegal. It is always a scary position for students to take a stand against government school authorities who hold significant power over their everyday lives," said Jeremy Dys, Senior Counsel for Liberty Institute. 
