RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.


SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 8, 2015 Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 1 Kings 17:10-16 Psalm 146:7, 8-9, 9-10 Hebrews 9: 24-28 Mark 12:38-44

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

In the course of his teaching Jesus said to the crowds, "Beware of the scribes, who like to go around in long robes and accept greetings in the marketplaces, seats of honor in synagogues, and places of honor at banquets. They devour the houses of widows and, as a pretext recite lengthy prayers. They will receive a very severe condemnation."

He sat down opposite the treasury and observed how the crowd put money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. A poor widow also came and put in two small coins worth a few cents. Calling his disciples to himself, he said to them,

"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

- 2. Relate a practical way you can contribute to the church besides putting money in the basket.
- 3. Relate a way emptiness in your life opened you up to God.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Pilot to passengers in midflight: "I regret to inform you that we are in terrible trouble. Only God can save us now." A passenger turned to a priest to ask what the pilot had said. The priest replied, "He says there's no hope." Just relying on human plan or depending on human strength alone would often time bring us to a hopeless situation. But each of us have within our human nature a divine potential that will make us hopeful even amidst the

most despairing conditions.

Today is the feast of ALL SAINTS. This feast is an invitation for all of us to realize in us the inner power and identity of having been created after God's image and the power of living as God's children in Baptism. Whatever our burdensome past be, however improper ways we have lived and whatever guilt or unworthiness we may suffer now.... they all could be changed.... Today we are called to look at ourselves to see how worthy we are and how holy we can become.

As today's Gospel proclaims that all our situations, even those of poverty, mourning, lowliness, hunger and thirst.... any and every situation is called by Jesus as the "BLESSED" situation because we carry something "BLESSED" within; and that "Blessed within us" is going to change everything around us. God wants each one of us to wake up to our inner capacity to become better than who we are now and to change everything around us.

All Saints Day is not merely a celebration of all the holy people who went before us. It is a call to each one of us to realize and live the power we have with in us to become holy and to change 'our lament into whirling dance, to ripe off our black mourning band and to deck ourselves with wildflowers... to burst forth into song" (Psalm 30:11-12). It is our feast. It is the feast of our real identity and inner power to change.

October 31st Halloween - November 1st All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the Christian holy day of All Hallows' Day (also known as *All Saints'*, *Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1 and All Souls' Day on November 2, thus giving the holiday on October 31st the full name of *All Hallows' Eve* which in popular use became *Halloween*.

God calls us to be saints and has given us the power to become saints. Thus when we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November 1st, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve (October 31st) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil only to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saints and Costume Mass on November 1st: In the background of what I explained above I invite all children, teens and adults with your Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Sunday, November 1st at 12:15 pm which will be followed by refreshments. Also some of us can come in the garment of a Saint (like St. Francis of Assisi, St. Elizabeth Ann Seaton, St. Kateri Tekakwitha, the first Native American Saint, St. Junipero Serra etc.). Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

We are just \$18,185 away from reaching our goal of the Catholic Ministries Appeal. When the goal is met we will get \$13,000 back to our parish in rebate. I kindly request those who have not participated in it, to consider making a contribution. Just a little more effort and we will get back our rebate. Thanks to those contributed.

I invite all the ministers and volunteers to attend a meeting to thank you and to explain your vital part in the mission of our parish on Saturday, November 7th. We will begin with 9:00 am mass and we will gather at Walden Hall for a short meeting with breakfast. Please make it a point to attend. You are the vital signs of the living parish and we very much need your participation.


