A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Wife: I cannot sleep. I keep thinking there's a mouse under the bed

Husband: Well, start thinking there's a cat under the bed and go to sleep.

Today's Gospel begins speaking about the terrible

signs of the days of tribulation – scary signs that can disturb one's sleep. If we take the signs themselves as reality they can scare us and make us lose sleep. But the signs have only indicative value. They indicate a reality to come. Though the signs seem to be terrifying in nature, the reality they indicate is the glorious coming of the Son of Man with power. Focusing on the Lord's coming will empower believers to live through the disturbing facts of the signs.

Jesus turns our attention to what happens in nature. When the tender branches sprout leaves, they stand as a sign indicating that summer is near. In the same way Jesus wants us to understand the sign value of these terrible things. He turns our focus from the terrifying signs to the reality they stand for, his nearness and proximity.

Our focus on the Lord and his nearness will change the nature of anything that happens to us in our life. If our focus is right on the Lord we will be empowered to look for something good even amidst the bad, and to experience something wonderful amidst the worrisome. If our focus is not on the Lord even the good will appear as evil and the most promising will look like most depressing.

Volunteers and Ministers Meet: On the occasion of Stewardship Sunday, volunteers and Liturgical ministers had a meeting after the 9:00am mass last Saturday, November 17th. It set a flame of enthusiasm on how to build a culture of faith to confront the crisis our younger generation goes through. The participants went home with an aim of each one trying to reach out to one person/family to bring to church. We need more volunteers and ministers to reach out to 80% of our parishioners who join the worship only occasionally like at Christmas, or

* A group that seeks to separate God from the military is demanding the relocation or removal of a sign at a Marine base in Hawaii that asks God's blessing on the Armed forces and reads, "God bless the military, their families and the civilians who work with them." Capt. T. Irish told the Marine Corps Times that the matter is currently under review.

"Only someone with a great misunderstanding of the First Amendment or an ax to grind against religion would claim that such a slogan poses a threat or is in any way unconstitutional," said retired Chaplain (COL) Ron Crews. "God bless our military' is a slogan little different than the official national motto, 'In God we trust' that appears so publicly on our money and the courts have repeatedly upheld it." * In 1925 a Maryland American Legion erected a World War I Veterans Memorial Cross inscribed, "This Memorial Cross Dedicated To The Heroes of Prince George's County Who Gave Their Lives In The Great War For The Liberty Of The World."

In February, 2014, the American Humanist Association filed a complaint alleging the memorial display violated the Establishment Clause.
