RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 3, 2016 The Epiphany of the Lord Isaiah 60: 1-6 Psalm 72: 1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13 Ephesians 3: 2-3A, 5-6 Matthew 2:1-12

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod, behold, magi from the east arrived in Jerusalem, saying,

"Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We saw his star at its rising and have come to do him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him. Assembling all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. They said to him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for thus it has been written through the prophet:

And you, Bethlehem, land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; since from you shall come a ruler,

who is to shepherd my people Israel."

Then Herod called the magi secretly and ascertained from them the time of the star's appearance. He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search diligently for the child. When you have found him, bring me word, that I too may go and do him homage." After their audience with the king they set out. And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they departed for their country by another way.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

One day as a young mother and her kindergarten-

aged son were driving down the street, the inquisitive little boy asked a revealing question. "Mommy, why do the idiots come out only when Daddy drives?" Family is the school where children learn to live more by imitation than instruction.

This Sunday is the feast of the Holy Family. God is far above to be reached or grasped by any human. So the unreachable Word of God incarnated as Jesus a human in a family, being a son of Mary, belonging to the family of David through Joseph. God is beyond all names and forms. But God became a human person in a family with a name (Jesus) and identity (Son of David). Family supplied him strength and support to grow as a human child. Family became the means by which an unapproachable God became approachable and lovable like a human child.

Holy Family reminds us of the importance of the family for each of us. It invites us to see that we are not merely the biological product of a man and woman's bodily union. Religion "Our Founding Fathers believed in God. In

fact, 51 of these 55 men who shaped the political foundations of our nation were Christians. When they spoke of our inalienable Rights being endowed by a Creator, they *de facto* set us in the direction of bringing religious and spiritual truths into public life. They knew that the new nation would quickly collapse without the recognition of God.

But God will not let himself be exiled from our life, public or private. The Christmas story is all about God entering into the whole of our human life. Nativity scenes are not sentimental memories of a past event. They are the reminder that, in the details of human life, in families struggling to find a place in this world, God is present. Because of the birth of Christ, all that touches us now touches God who in his freedom loves us and calls us to share his life.

Christmas, therefore, is about freedom, the freedom to believe in a God who stoops from the hidden recesses of eternity and enters time to be one with us. Against the darkness of unbelief, Christmas is the glad tidings of great joy that life has a purpose. Christmas is about the freedom of religion to cast the light of truth on life, on all life, as valued and loved by God."
