FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Little Jane was going to bed when her grandmother told her: 'Don't forget, dear, to include Grandma in your prayers tonight, that God should bless her and let her live to be very, very old.'

"Oh very, very old?" replied Jane, "I'd rather pray that God would make her young."

When we begin 2016, we mean that the earth has gone round the sun 2,015 times since the birth of Jesus. Though it has gone around the earth billions of times

before the birth of Jesus, we call this new round for the 2016th time the NEW YEAR.

On the one hand we know for a fact that it is the repeat of earth's round as it did in the past; on the other hand we believe that the start of this round can bring something NEW. We look at the 2016th round (Year) to be a very young (just three days old so far) and new.

Today is the Feast of Epiphany. It is the feast of the new born God-Man Jesus manifesting His Divine self to the wise men who visited him in the manger. Grant me a healthy body, and the necessary good humor to maintain it.

Grant me a simple soul that knows to treasure all that is good and that doesn't frighten easily at the sight of evil, but rather finds the means to put things back in their place.

Give me a soul that knows not boredom, grumblings, sighs and laments, nor excess of stress, because of that obstructing thing called "I."

Proclamation by Pres. Obama of annual commemoration.

Religious Freedom Sunday will be celebrated on January 10, 2016, the Sunday before National Religious Freedom day.

Since 1993, the President proclaims each January 16 as Religious Freedom Day to commemorate the Virginia General Assembly's adoption of Thomas Jefferson's landmark "Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom" on Jan. 16, 1786. That Statute became the basis for the U.S. Constitution's First Amendment and led to freedom of religion for all Americans. (www.wikipedia.org)

Today, religious freedom is being challenged in many corners of American society including schools, hospitals, health care, charities and businesses. Since the 1980's, more than a dozen non-profit, free representation legal foundations have emerged focusing on defending religious freedom. "Every generation has its own fight over religious freedom - it's a debate that has driven the American story from the day the pilgrims set sail on the Mayflower ...", said a Becket Fund spokesperson.
