Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 17, 2016 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 62: 1-5 Psalm 96: 1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10 1 Corinthians 12:4-11 John 2: 1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him,

"They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her,

"Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers,

"Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them,

"Fill the jars with water."

So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter."

So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

Focus Questions:

- 1. Where have you experienced not having enough? What did you do?
- 2. Describe a recent "ordinary" event that ended up having extraordinary meaning for you.
- 3. Recall a time when you interfered in a situation and it turned out well.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you helped someone as Mary tried to help the young couple at their wedding feast.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A mother was deeply hurt by the behavior of her fifteen year old son. Each time they went out together he would walk ahead of her. One day she asked him. "Are you ashamed of walking with me?" "Oh, Mom, no" was his embarrassed reply. "It's just that you look so young that I'm worried my friends will suspect I have a new girlfriend." Her hurt vanished as if by magic when the son revealed her youth and beauty to mom

Today's Solemn Feast of the Baptism of the Lord reveals who Jesus is. Jesus as God does not need baptism as we do, to be forgiven of Original Sin. Baptism in the case of Jesus is a moment of revelation proclaiming who He is. Today's Gospel reading narrates this picturesquely. When Jesus was baptized, the Holy

Spirit descended upon Him and a voice spoke from heaven "You are my Beloved son with you I am well pleased." In Baptism God declares to the world who Jesus is and how much He is pleased with Him.

We are baptized in the name of the Trinity, in the name of God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We are able to participate in the grace of God because Jesus shared with our humanity his divinity by becoming a man. We become God's children because the Father has benevolently accepted us. We receive the Holy Spirit and thus are forgiven of our Original sin and made a Temple of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus' Baptism reminds of what happens to us in our Baptism. Though we are unworthy of becoming God's children because of our natural tendency to sin, we, by God's grace, are accepted and declared as children of God..... we become God's beloved daughters and sons in whom God is well pleased. What God declared of Jesus is declared of us.

Forty eight years ago, a week before Christmas the Parish Community of St. Thomas More was born. At this Christmas 2015 we have begun our 49th year. We thank God's providence for having journeyed with us. We gratefully remember our founding generations and the ongoing generations for their enthusiastic faith-filled participation in bringing up the parish to where we are now – a warm community 'Sharing the Spirit of Love'. Our foregone generation has handed over the torch of faith to us and it is now our turn to keep the flame of faith alive and pass it over to our next generation.... The previous generation worshiped humbly in a 'Coffin Factory and left a church in our hands. Let us add our part of making it a little more alive and enthusiastic, a bit more welcoming and meaningful to our children and grandchildren. If each one of us could bring one more person to our congregation, soon it will become doubly bigger. Please talk to someone; invite anyone and bring everyone. Because 'Sharing the Spirit of Love' is our motto and identity of being the family of St. Thomas

JUBILEE – 50 Grace filled Years of God's
community of St. Thomas More. Let us move on to a new phase of our parish in inner spirituality. As we grow as a community let us renew and present our new face of the church to the next generation. Religious Freedom Sunday (Jan. 10) is a national event in which churches inform

parents, students, and educators within their congregations about the freedom of religious expression students from Kindergarten through twelfth grade have at school. (religiousfreedomsunday.com - usccb)

Almost 20 years ago, the U.S. Department of Education directed public schools to tell students what their religious freedom are. "Catholics For Freedom of Religion" remembers National Religious Freedom Day, Jan.16th each year, with "Free to Speak" pamphlets, published by Gateways to Better Education, to help students and teachers know their civil liberties. "We want our young people to be bold in their faith. We have let them know they can be. That it's perfectly legal for them to be bold," said Director Eric Buehrer.
