BAPTISM—As soon as your child is born, please call the Parish Office to make Baptism arrangements. Preparation session and welcoming Mass attendance are required.

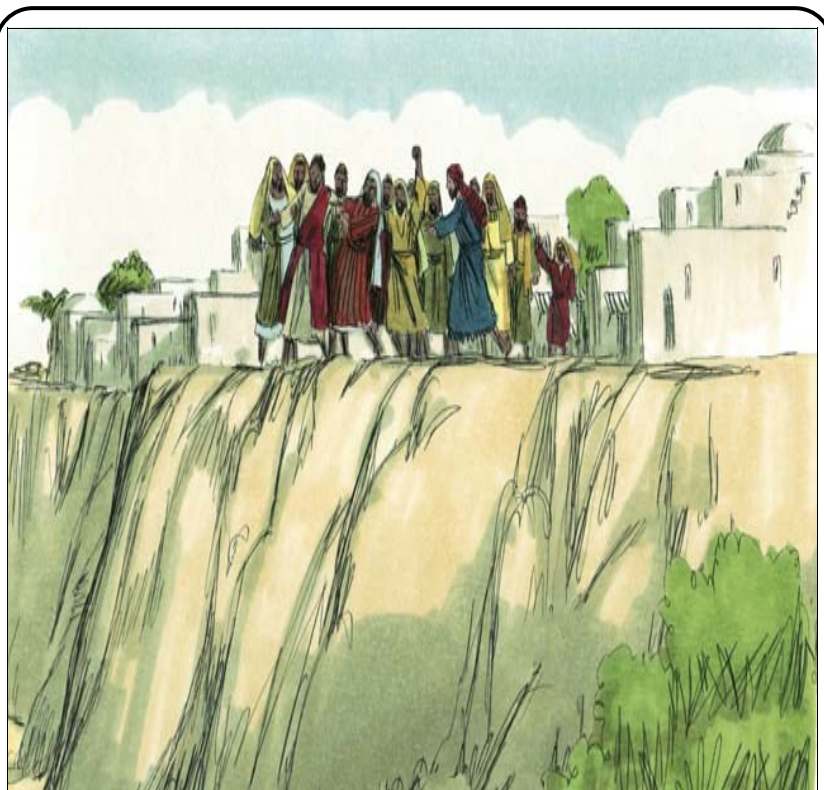

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 7, 2016
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 6:1-2A, 3-8
Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8
1 Corinthians 15:1-11
Luke 5:1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

Focus Questions:

1. What are some of the things Jesus would ask you to leave behind to follow him?.
2. What have you done to try to "catch people" for the Lord?
3. Name someone who is humble as St. Peter was when meeting Jesus?

Family and children's question:

Talk about how God works in your life. What do you think God is asking of you this day?

PARISH OUTREACH

AND THE COLD WEATHER HAS BEGUN....

Today's CONTRANYM is "BOUND". It has two opposite meaning; heading to a destination, or restrained from movement. On these cold winter days, we often feel a sense of frustration – we want to be bound for a destination, but the weather sometimes restricts our movements, whether it's icy roads or frigid temperatures that make going outside a disheartening experience. In those cases, we are bound from movement. We have been talking about being capable of the experiences we mentioned (going places)...but what about if we are bound (restrained) because of other reasons? What if there is no car available? What if we can't afford the gas for the car? What if we are disabled and can't get around?

These are very real situations that face many of our clients here at Outreach. We try to help out by providing rides to doctors, and delivering food to our disabled clientele. In rare cases, we provide emergency gas cards to those in dire need. Especially in winter, though, all these situations are more depressing than at other times of the year, and we try especially hard to help those in need.
