RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



February 14, 2016 First Sunday of Lent **Deuteronomy 26:4-10** Psalm 91: 1-2, 10-11, 12-13, 14-15 Romans 10: 8-13 Luke 4:1-13

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

An elephant broke loose from the herd and charged across a little wooden structure that stretched across a ravine. The worn-out bridge shivered and groaned barely able to support the elephant's weight.

Once the elephant had gone safely to the other side, a flea that had lodged itself in the elephant's ear exclaimed in mighty satisfaction, "Boy, did we shake that bridge." The readings of this week explains that a fly can feel the strength of an elephant if it is touched by God's grace.

In the second reading Paul says, "I am the least of the Apostles But by the grace of God I am what I am." In spite of being the least of all apostles, Paul proudly acknowledges that he toiled harder than all of them because of God's grace working effectively in him.

In today's Gospel Peter toiled through the night in vain but at the word of Jesus he caught a great number of fish. Life without the grace of God is merely toil and burden. When it is touched by God's grace, our every act becomes God's act. We may feel that we are tiny or insignificant but when we allow ourselves to be touched by the grace of God, we become God's expression and God's work.

The Year of Mercy invites us to open ourselves to be enveloped by God's mercy. May the hardness of our hearts be melted and made sensitive to God's mercy around and within us. May mercy overwhelm us; may it overflow from us as God's act bringing joy and peace to all.

This Wednesday, February 10th is Ash Wednesday, the start of the Lenten season. Lent is a time of grace. We reflect on the mystery of God sharing in our suffering. In Jesus God shared with us even in death. God shared with our suffering not just to console us but to radically change the moment of suffering into occasions of inner strength. He shared in our death in order to transform it into eternal life.

Lent is a spiritual exercise for 40 days. Our parish offers various spiritual exercises to grow in God's grace.

Every day we have Lenten morning prayers before the 9:00 am mass.

Every Friday we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm for grace upon those undergoing various sufferings.

Pranayama (Breathing meditation) for four Tuesdays — Feb 16, Feb. 23, March 1 and March 8 at 9:45 am and 7:00 pm —a spiritual exercise to realize our inner energy to live more effectively and peacefully.

Lenten Mission by Fr. Fitzsimmons from March 13 to 17 both in the morning mass at 9 am and in the evening at 7:00 pm.

Lenten Project in this Year of Mercy is through the Catholic Relief Services to help the welfare and education of the refugee children in various refugee camps.

GOLDEN JUBILEE: How old are we? 50 years old or young? In December of 2017 our parish will complete 50 years of faith-walk with Jesus. In the scale of the Church History which is over 2 millennium years old, our 50 years is just a drop in the bucket. We are a very young community. But in our own personal scale we are a maturing faith-community of 50 years. God has helped us grow in faith in Jesus and to witness life to Gospel values. Our way of worshiping and serving each other reflects a sincere dedication to Gospel values.

Whatever we do is a reflection of what we have treasured as faith for the last 50 years. Let the Golden Jubilee be the celebration of our dedication to the Gospel and our faith in

God. Let it proclaim what we treasure, and project a new vigor for our next generation. Let us feel that we don't grow old but grow stronger. Our witness springs from Jesus and spreads the sweet aroma of His newness. Let us remember that we are the containers of Jesus, the wine; we never grow old, we only become vintage. Our faith never withers but only multiplies and become abundant.

The Catholic Ministries Appeal 2016: Our Parish's assessment this year is \$68,500. Last year we made 78.55% of our Goal. When we reach our goal we will get a rebate of approximately \$13,000. Thus our generosity will help both others and our parish through the rebate.

PARISH OUTREACH

AND THE COLD WEATHER HAS BEGUN....

Today's CONTRANYM is "BOUND". It has two opposite meaning; heading to a destination,

On these cold winter days, we often feel a sense of frustration – we want to be bound for a destination, but the weather sometimes restricts our movements, whether it's icy roads or frigid temperatures that make going outside a disheartening experience. In those cases, we are bound from movement. We have been talking about being capable of the experiences we mentioned (going places)...but what about if we are bound

What if we can't afford the gas for the car? What if we are disabled and can't get around? These are very real situations that face many of our clients here at Outreach. We try to help out by providing rides to doctors, and delivering food to our disabled clientele. In rare cases, we provide emergency gas cards to those in dire need. Especially in winter, though, all these situations are more depressing than at other times of the year, and we try especially hard to help those in need.

Discrimination Against Churches:



Responding to a disgruntled neighbor complaint, town officials in Jefferson Parish, LA, issued a criminal summons against the pastor of Vintage Church, claiming their services were "too loud." The town imposed

a noise level restriction of 60dB - the noise equivalent of a dishwasher, clothes dryer, or 1-1 conversation. While there are limits on church sounds, other noises like power tools, demolition sounds and construction sounds are not restricted. Liberty Institute attorneys say the government's demand violates The Louisiana Preservation of Religious Freedom Act, which states: "Government shall not substantially burden a person's exercise of religion ..." (libertyinstitute.org, 12/10/15; dailycaller.com, 12/15/15)

A similar incident occurred in 2015 in Gilbert, AZ, where the city had different ordinances for politics, business and church signs. Regulations for church signs were significantly stricter and smaller than for political or business signs.

In June, 2015, the Supreme Court ruled in favor of the AZ church, saying its free speech and religious liberty were violated by the local government ordinance unfairly discriminating against the church. (alliancedefendingfreedom.org; dailycaller.com, 6/18/15)
