RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 27, 2016 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord Acts 10:34A, 37-43 Psalm 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23 Colossians 3:1-4 John 20:1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them,

"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in.

When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place.

Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

Focus Questions:

1. Share a memory of a joyful Easter celebration.

2. Describe a time when you felt the absence of the Lord and then suddenly He was there.

3. Relate a time when you handled an unexpected and surprising change.

Talk about some of the signs, symbols and customs of Easter in your home or in church and how they relate to the Resurrection. FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Patient: How can I live to be a hundred, doctor? Doctor: Give up cookies, cake, and ice cream. Stop eating red meat, potatoes, and bread. And no soft drinks. Patient: And if I do that, I will live to be a hundred? Doctor: May be not, but it will certainly seem like it. 'Giving up something for Lent' was one of the spiritual exercises we started on Ash Wednesday, February 10th. Today, March 20th is Palm Sunday, the 40th day of Lent. We tried our best to 'give up' something for the past 40 days, to begin HOLY WEEK today, to take the journey with Jesus in His Passion, Death and Resurrection. Our 'giving up' is a preparation to experience along with Jesus who 'gives up' himself sacramentally as food (Eucharist) on Holy Thursday during his Last Supper, then 'gives his life' for us on the Cross on Good Friday. On Holy Saturday, he would be in the tomb to express that He gave up everything in order to embrace all human conditions from birth to death. Now nothing hinders him from uniting with us. His Resurrection on Easter Sunday is the confirmation that he 'gives up' being God and is united totally to us humans, that we by 'giving up' all that is binding us to human weakness, can 'gain' the Power of New Life along with Jesus.

Holy week is the time of 'giving up' along with Jesus in His Death, to pass on to 'gaining' divine power of New Life along with Jesus in his Resurrection. The goal of Our Lenten 40 days with all its spiritual exercises is to bring us to this highlight of passing with Jesus from death to glorious Resurrection. Please check the Holy Week schedule in the bulletin. Try to participate in all the events. In these Liturgical events we will remember Jesus' last week on earth. By remembering this we will celebrate God's love and life for us. By celebrating we believe and experience within us God's offer of New Resurrected Life in Jesus. I personally invite all of you to eagerly participate in all the Holy Week events. Come with your 'giving up' in order to 'gain' the New Life of Resurrection.

Reconciliation Monday: Monday 21st is Reconciliation Monday. Confessions will be heard from 3pm to 9pm in our Church and in all the Catholic Churches of our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Individual Confession cleanses and illumines the hearts to enter into the mystery of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. All are welcome.

Our heartfelt thanks to Fr. Fitzsimmons who conducted a dynamic three-day mission in our Parish, and to all who worked to make the mission a success. We are also grateful to those who joined us for all or part of the mission. It is our prayerful hope that his inspirational talks will help us to allow Jesus to work in our lives, most especially during Holy Week leading to Easter.

Next Sunday is Easter Sunday. We celebrate the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ from death. Like Christmas, Easter will be the occasion when the whole family of St. Thomas More will attend Mass. Every mass will be extremely crowded. We will invite all with a smile. We will pray for them every day of this Holy Week that everyone who comes will be touched by the New Life of the Resurrection. That immeasurable love and mercy of the Crucified and Risen Lord will inspire a new way of living in them. May our warmth ad friendliness welcome them to worship God with us in our Church more frequently.

Genocide against Christians:

As Christians in America prepare for Holy Week, pressure is mounting for the U.S. to declare Christians as genocide victims at the hands of Islamic State (ISIS). A genocide designation is important because it creates a legal - and moral - requirement for action that can involve granting refugee status to these victims and increasing humanitarian aid.

The Middle East is the birthplace of Christianity and had enjoyed a restricted but thriving culture. However, today "there's no evidence whatsoever of any Christian life left in the caliphate," said Nina Shea, director of Hudson Institute Center for Religious Freedom. "There's no active churches, liturgies or congregations."

"ISIS commits mass murder, beheadings, crucifixions,

rape, torture, enslavement, and the kidnapping of children, among other atrocities," stated Rep. Ed Royce (CA). LENTEN PROJECT 2016

CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES WORKING TO PREVENT A LOST GENERATION

The donations collected for this year's Lenten project will go to help Catholic Relief Services in their outreach to the children of Syrian refugees. CRS provides more than 53,546 Syrian Refugee children with education classes, school materials, counseling, recreational activities, and safe spaces to learn and play. Since the conflict began in Syria five years ago, 7.5 million children are in need of humanitarian aid, 2.5 million children are no longer in school. According to UNICEF, for Syrian children, "what is at stake isn't politics. It's their future. Having already lost their homes, schools and communities, their chance of building a future may also soon be lost." Catholic Relief Services is working, along with Caritas, on the ground in Syria, Lebanon, Jordan, Egypt and Greece helping children and their families with food, clothing, housing and education. Pope Francis' first pastoral visit outside of Rome was to the tiny island of Lampedusa, where many refugees landed after making the perilous sea voyage from North Africa. Two years later, he is still urging the Church and the world not to turn their backs on the suffering of those people fleeing conflict and death. Pope Francis has declared this year to be a Jubilee Year of Mercy. Remember Jesus' words in Matthew 25 "Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for Me." Donations can be placed in the Lenten Project House in the narthex or can be collected in the CRS Rice Bowls and brought back to Church at the end of Lent. We are also encouraging all parishioners to fill in a heart (found in an envelope on the narthex bulletin board) with words of hope and encouragement for the refugee children. These notes will be forwarded by CRS to the refugee camps and connect the people of St. Thomas More to those children. Directions, and sam-
