Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 17, 2016 Fourth Sunday of Easter Acts 13:14, 43-52 Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13 Revelation 7: 9, 14b-17 John 10: 27-30

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his Disciples after being raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

- 1. Describe a time when you heard the voice of the Good Shepherd.
- 2. How does being a member of the flock have an impact on your life?
- 3. Jesus says no one can take away those that have been given to him by his Father. How do these words help you when you think of loved ones who have strayed from the Shepherd?

Who are the voices that you listen to who help you to know Jesus?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"My wife has been cooking a chicken for two days."
"For two days?"

"Yeah! The cookbook said to cook it one-half-hour to the pound. And my wife weighs 110 pounds."

Cooking is an art; a personal expression not a product of what a book says.

Faith too is a living expression of trusting God and humans. Faith is neither a mechanical product of observing certain rules or regulations, nor meticulously fulfilling certain expectations or obligations.

Today's Gospel narrates two stories of faith. The first story is about the disciples who labored the whole night but caught no fish. But at the word of Jesus they caught an abundance of fish. At the plentiful catch, their attentions turn away from the fish to the One who helped them with the abundance. The material paves way to the spiritual belief in Jesus.

The second story is about Jesus forgiving Peter who denied Him three times. The mercy from the heart of Jesus changes Peter's denial into committed love. His denial did not make Jesus lose faith in Peter. He still believes in Peter. Jesus's merciful forgiveness removes Peter's guilt and revives his faith in Jesus.

Faith is not a tit-for-tat-action. Faith is not our measured reaction to what others do or do not do to us. Faith does not move in the world of human rules of

judgment and evaluation. Faith in God is a leaf into the heart of God, totally trusting in God's goodness. Likewise Faith in the other is a leap into the other's heart believing in their goodness despite all their weaknesses and shortcomings. Faith is a gift from God and it should be our gift to others. Let us believe in God and in each other.

Please pray for Fr. Peter O'Rourke. We hear that he fell and broke his hip. He is now hospitalized in a coma. Let us pray that God be gracious to touch him with healing grace and that he be made strong and healthy to live God's will.

Exempting Pepsi and Exxon Mobil, but not the Little Sisters

On March 23, 2016, oral arguments were presented to the Supreme Court on behalf of the Little Sisters of the Poor and other nonprofit religious organizations, asking for the same exemption already given to corporations like Pepsi, Exxon Mobil and VISA as well as the U.S. military and small businesses. The government has excused one in three Americans, but has refused to exempt the Little Sisters and religious organizations from providing abortion inducing drugs and other goods and services in violation of their well known and deeply held religious convictions.

Instead of exempting them, the administration had presented an "accommodation" that forces the Little Sisters, etc., to sign a form that would "shift" this responsibility to provide the objectionable coverage to the insurance company, thereby forcing the Sisters to be complicit in a sin against their religious beliefs. And to make them even more complicit, the Little Sisters and others would still end up paying for the abortion/contraception coverage through insurance premiums or payments to a third-party administrator.

Many religious groups, including Muslims, Mormons, Orthodox Jews and American Indians, have supported the Little Sisters, saying the mandate is an "unprecedented threat to religious liberty in this country." (pathos.com, 3/23/16; dailysignal.com, 3/23/16)

During the oral arguments, the justices seemed to be split. Justice Breyer said, "Sometimes when a religious person who's not a hermit or a monk is a member of society, he does have to accept all kinds of things that are just terrible for him." In contrast, Justice Kennedy repeatedly questioned whether the government was making the Little Sisters "complicit in the moral wrong" by hijacking their insurance plans.
