RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.


SACRAMENT OF THE SICK—Call the Church Office to request visitation of the sick.



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 8, 2016 Seventh Sunday of Easter Acts 7: 55-60 Psalm 97: 1-2, 6-7, 9 Revelation 22: 12-14, 16-17, 20 John 17:20-26

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me. And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world. Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me. I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

Focus Questions:

- 1. Jesus said his followers were a gift to him from the Father. How does being considered a gift from God impact you?
- 2. Jesus prayed that the world may believe in him. How do you give witness to your faith?
- 3. Jesus prayed that his followers are one as he and the Father are one. Describe a time when you experienced that unity with other followers of Jesus.

Jesus talked about the love he and the Father have. Today is Mother's Day. What will you do to express love for your mother?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Pam: I fell off a sixty-foot ladder today.

Sam: It's a miracle you were not killed. Pam: Oh, I only fell off the first rung.

Words have limited meaning. The subtle use of a word can conceal or twist its real meaning. Unless we wish to hear the words beyond their limitations we cannot grasp the meaning expressed by the speaker. It is the same story with our human limitations. We have a richer inner self which gets expressed through our limitations.

In the first reading the early Church takes the bold step to cross the limitations of circumcision (Jewish – Rite) in order to welcome the non-circumcised (non-Jewish) Christians into the community of believers in Jesus. When they experienced that God works even among the non-circumcised, they were liberated from the narrow understanding that circumcision is a necessary step to believe in Jesus Christ. It is not through some rite but through a believing heart which is the way to live and love God and others.

In the Gospel Jesus reminds his disciples that they might not have everything to start the church but the Holy Spirit will supply all that they lack. The Church is not what we have or lack but whom we believe in. We will never be a perfect church and possess all the

sufficient tools to express our faith. The basic call is to believe that it is not us but God who works in us. God provides sufficient divine grace to us, the Church. Let us allow the Holy Spirit, the promised gift of God from Jesus to illumine and empower us to be God's messengers and servants.

Freedom of Conscience in Jeopardy for Health
REGION Care Workers:

Recent times have seen numerous incidents in which nurses, doctors, hospital staff and other health care workers are being pressured, required and forced to provide morally -controversial procedures.

- * NY City operating room nurse, Cathy Cenzon-DeCarlo, was forced to participate in a gruesome dismemberment of a 22-week-old-fetus, threatened with loss of her nursing license and job. (usccb.org, 12/4/15)
- * CA started forcing almost all health plans to pay for all abortions without exemption for moral or religious objections. Catholic Bishops fear a mandate to force religious hospitals is next. CA policy clearly violates existing law but there are loopholes and weaknesses that make federal laws ineffective.
- * Alaska Supreme Court ordered a pro-life hospital to allow its facilities to be used for abortions. (cnsnews.com, 3/29/16)
- * An American accreditation agency mandated all medical students must receive abortion training. It took passage of a federal law to protect students' rights of conscience. (cqrcengage.com/catholic charities)

Cardinal Dolan, NY, and Archbishop Lori, Baltimore, chair pro-life and religious liberty committees urging support of a proposed **Conscience Protection Act** now before Congress. "While federal laws exist now to protect conscience rights in health care, there is clearly a need for legislation to make this protection truly effective," said a USCCB spokesman. Angel of Hope: A Walk to Remember

On Saturday, May 7th, 2016 Angela's House will be hosting an *Angel of Hope: A Walk to Remember*. This event will take place at Eisenhower Park, where the Angel of Hope statue has stood since 2008. During the past eight years a candle light vigil has been held on the first Saturday of December, which gives hope to over 300 individuals that attend this spiritual gathering. Due to the positive response, this walk is created as an additional event for people to come together.

The Angel was brought to Long Island by Bob Policastro the founder of Angela's House. It comes from a best-selling book and television movie called *The Christmas Box* by Richard Paul Evans, who inspired this statue. In the story, an elderly woman mourns the death of her little daughter by making regular trips to the child's grave, which is marked with an angel statue (Angel of Hope). The statue evokes a profound and miraculous connection between mother and child and helps convey valuable lessons about the true meaning of life to others. This simple, non-religious but spiritual story has brought hope to thousands of parents who have endured the death of a child.

As spring begins, Mother's Day is celebrated by most families, but sadly there are many who walk with the pain of losing a child. They always have a space in their heart where that love is still carried. Our hope is to allow the Angel of Hope to be a reminder that the love shared with their child was a blessing and can always be cherished and remembered. All who knew the child, but especially their parents, need to feel hope that they will survive and move on, and that these children will never be forgotten.

Registration for the event will begin promptly at 9:30am at the Kite Field, located next to the statue. which is located in the Veterans Memorial section of Eisenhower Park. (Parking field 6 is the ideal location to park.) The ceremony, which will begin by 10:15am, will include a 20 minute non-religious, nondenominational, Spiritual Ceremony which has been written to be reflective, focusing on the love that is missed and will always be carried by the loved ones of these children. Led by Executive Director, Bob Policastro, we will also be joined by our guest speaker, David Roberts, who lost his daughter in 2003 from Cancer. David speaks nationally at conferences, writes blogs reflecting his life experiences for the Huffington Post, Open to Hope and various other online periodicals and websites. In addition, Patty Furino, a grief counsellor will lead a quiet reflection, and a simple prayer to

inspire peace.

To conclude the ceremony choirs from around Long Island have been invited. Members of the New Apostolic Church and the Willow Interfaith Women's Choir will lead the attendees and participants in singing "Clouds," a beautiful song written by Zach Sobiech. He touched so many lives with this song, and continues to do so despite losing his battle to cancer a few years ago. (You can view this song by searching for it on YouTube .

Upon its completion, the attendees will then follow a path around Salisbury Lake, hopefully inspired to look up at the clouds, knowing their child has been remembered and cherished. The walk, which is less than a mile long, will conclude at the statue. We hope to invoke the feeling of faith and hope and make this event an inspiring day for all who participate. We truly believe this type of event will help families dealing with the loss of a child during Mother's Day weekend.

Angel of Hope: A Walk to Remember

On Saturday, May 7th, 2016 Angela's House will be hosting an *Angel of Hope: A Walk to Remember*. This event will take place at Eisenhower Park, where the Angel of Hope statue has stood since 2008. During the past eight years a candle light vigil has been held on the first Saturday of December, which gives hope to over 300 individuals that attend this spiritual gathering. Due to the positive response, this walk is created as an additional event for people to come together.

The Angel was brought to Long Island by Bob Policastro the founder of Angela's House. It comes from a best-selling book and television movie called *The Christmas Box* by Richard Paul Evans, who inspired this statue. In the story, an elderly woman mourns the death of her little daughter by making regular trips to the child's grave, which is marked with an angel statue (Angel of Hope). The statue evokes a profound and miraculous connection between mother and child and helps convey valuable lessons about the true meaning of life to others. This simple, non-religious but spiritual story has brought hope to thousands of parents who have endured the death of a child.

As spring begins, Mother's Day is celebrated by most families, but sadly there are many who walk with the pain of losing a child. They always have a space in their heart where that love is still carried. Our hope is to allow the Angel of Hope to be a reminder that the love shared with their child was a blessing and can always be cherished and remembered. All who knew the child, but especially their parents, need to feel hope that they will survive and move on, and that these children will never be forgotten.

Registration for the event will begin promptly at 9:30am at the Kite Field, located next to the statue, which is located in the Veterans Memorial section of Eisenhower Park. (Parking field 6 is the ideal location to park.) The ceremony, which will begin by 10:15am, will include a 20 minute non-religious, non-denominational, Spiritual Ceremony which has been written to be reflective, focusing on the love that is missed and will always be carried by the loved ones of these children. Led by Executive Director, Bob Policastro, we will also be joined by our guest speaker, David Roberts, who lost his daughter in 2003 from Cancer. David speaks nationally at conferences, writes blogs reflecting his life experiences for the Huffington Post, Open to Hope and various other online periodicals and websites. In addition, Patty Furino, a grief counsellor

will lead a quiet reflection, and a simple prayer to inspire peace.

To conclude the ceremony choirs from around Long Island have been invited. Members of the New Apostolic Church and the Willow Interfaith Women's Choir will lead the attendees and participants in singing "Clouds," a beautiful song written by Zach Sobiech. He touched so many lives with this song, and continues to do so despite losing his battle to cancer a few years ago. (You can view this song by searching for it on YouTube.

Upon its completion, the attendees will then follow a path around Salisbury Lake, hopefully inspired to look up at the clouds, knowing their child has been remembered and cherished. The walk, which is less than a mile long, will conclude at the statue. We hope to invoke the feeling of faith and hope and make this event an inspiring day for all who participate. We truly believe this type of event will help families dealing with the loss of a child during Mother's Day weekend.
