RECONCILIATION—Celebrated in Church every Saturday from 4pm to 4:45pm, or by previous appointment with Parish Office.



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Mother to fussy son: "Twenty years from now you'll be telling some girl what a great cook your mother was..... now, eat your dinner".

Today is Mother's Day. Every one of us dwelt in our mother's womb for nine months, nurtured, cared, loved and provided for by her. God still continues creating new lives through parents and it is the mother who materializes God's gift of life in her womb. Mothers are the channels of God's continuing work of creation. Let us wish them and pray for them with gratitude that God's blessings be ever upon them for the joy of creation to continue in humanity.

The readings of this week speak about Jesus' care for His believers (Church) that he would never abandon them without any help in their big commission of continuing His Mission. He would be with us forever through the working of the Holy Spirit within us.

The Gospel today is a very heart-moving prayer of Jesus at the Last Supper. He reveals the truth that we are included in the love of God the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. We, the believers are one with the Triune God. He prays that we, the Church of believers might realize this union with God in love: "Holy Father I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me that they may be brought to perfection as one."

Next weekend is Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost is a Greek word which means fifty. Next Sunday is the fiftieth day of Easter. On the 50th day Jesus sent the gift of the Holy Spirit from God the Father upon the disciples. Let us pray for the next seven days that we may be able recipients of the Holy Spirit, the Divine Gift of God the Father in the name of His son Jesus Christ.

Red Balloons: Every year we tie red balloons to cars on Pentecost Sunday. This has a spiritual meaning. Red is the color to signify the red flame of fire that settled upon the disciples when they received the Holy Spirit on Pentecost Sunday. The balloon filled with air signifies us who are filled with the Holy Spirit in Baptism, Confirmation and the other Sacraments. The rising balloon means that the Holy Spirit always uplifts us heavenwards. While we thank all those who worked hard to tie the balloons to our cars, please carry them carefully home and tie them to your mail box.... Let everyone know that your household is filled with the divine gift of the Holy Spirit.

Catholics for Freedom of Religion

Why Does Religious Freedom Matter? (Part 1)

Religious liberty and a thriving religious culture are defining attributes of the U.S., characterizing America as much as its political system and

market economy.

"The Government of the U.S., which gives bigotry no sanction, to persecution no assistance, requires only that they who live under its protection should demean themselves as good citizens George Washington.

The Founders argued that virtue derived from religion is indispensable to limited government. Therefore, the Constitution guaranteed religious freedom while prohibiting the establishment of a national religion.

Today, the religious roots of America and the role of religion in its continued success are poorly understood. One source of the confusion is the misunderstood phrase, "separation of church and state," used by President Thomas Jefferson in a letter to the Danbury Baptist Association of Connecticut in 1802. Many believe this means a radical separation of religion and politics. This is incorrect: Jefferson wanted to protect states' freedom of religion from federal government control and without government interference.

The American model of religious liberty assumes that religious believers and institutions will take active roles in society. In fact, the American Founders considered religious engagement in shaping the public morality essential to ordered liberty and self-government.
