



Luke 7:11-17

#### A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus journeyed to a city called Nain, and his disciples and a large crowd accompanied him. As he drew near to the gate of the city, a man who had died was being carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow.

A large crowd from the city was with her.

When the Lord saw her, he was moved with pity for her and said to her,

"Do not weep."

He stepped forward and touched the coffin; at this the bearers halted, and he said, "Young man, I tell you, arise!" The dead man sat up and began to speak, and Jesus gave him to his mother. Fear seized them all, and they glorified God, crying out

"A great prophet has arisen in our midst, " and "God has visited his people."

This report about him spread through the whole of Judea and in all the surrounding region.

## FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Note from writer to editor: The characters in this novel are entirely fictional and have no resemblance to any person living or dead.

Note from editor to writer: That's what is wrong with them.

God writes the human story, not as a fiction but as divine history, pervading it from the beginning to end with His real presence acting and reacting with living creatures.

Today's Solemn Feast of CORPUS CHRISTI (Body and Blood of Christ) proclaims how God comes to us and mingles with us as food. God is not a fiction but our food in Jesus. We don't imagine or dream of God. We can touch and taste God as Jesus. God offers Jesus' body in the form of bread to be eaten and his blood in the form of wine to be drunk.

The food we eat provides life and growth to the body and thus becomes our body. Jesus becomes our food. When we eat his flesh and drink his blood he becomes our body providing his life and growth Io our body. By eating Him, he mingles with us and become one with us. His presence within us transforms us. We become his extended Christ.

Jesus is not a fiction but a divine history in us. He is not simply a role model whom we have to imitate with our strivings. He becomes our life and power. As Paul says, "It is not we who live but Christ begins to live in us." Today's feast is a radical spiritual realization that our mortal body is turned into Christ's eternal mystical body because we become what we eat. We eat Christ's body and drink His blood and we become Christ like.

# Memorial Day: A Catholic Understanding of the Nature and Call of Freedom:

Why are human beings willing to fight and die for freedom? As Americans, this Memorial Day we remember those who died in service of our country. But as Catholic Americans, we reflect on the meaning of true freedom - a freedom we as Catholics are called to live to the fullest. In *The Gospel of Life*, Pope John Paul II shows us that when freedom is no longer based on objective truth, it destroys itself. When a person declares himself totally selfgoverning, autonomous, deciding his own truth, as in a secular state, then people will eventually reject each other, as each person seeks to have his own interests prevail. Such a society does not become more free; it becomes less free as vice, corruption, brutality and oppression inevitably increase.

One reason we human beings are willing to fight and die for freedom is because the need for freedom is imprinted into our very nature. By virtue of our ability to reason and our free will, we are impelled to seek truth, especially religious truth. Our creator instilled this drive in us so that we would seek Him, for He is truth. Having found truth, we must live it and to do this we must be free from coercion. Therefore, if attacked, human beings will rightly and necessarily die for true freedom.

This Memorial Day, Catholics rightly honor our fallen brothers and sisters, and remember our Church, who has defended the dignity and freedom of the human person for 2,000 years.
