Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 12, 2016 Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Samuel 12:7-10, 13 Psalm 32:1-2, 5, 7, 11 Galatians 2:16, 19-21 Luke 7:36--8:3

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

A Pharisee invited Jesus to dine with him, and he entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at table. Now there was a sinful woman in the city who learned that he was at table in the house of the Pharisee. Bringing an alabaster flask of ointment, she stood behind him at his feet weeping and began to bathe his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them, and anointed them with the ointment. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who and what sort of woman this is who is touching him, that she is a sinner." Jesus said to him in reply, "Simon, I have something to say to you." "Tell me, teacher," he said. "Two people were in debt to a certain creditor; one owed five hundred days' wages and the other owed fifty. Since they were unable to repay the debt, he forgave it for both. Which of them will love him more?" Simon said in reply, "The one, I suppose, whose larger debt was forgiven." He said to him, "You have judged rightly." Then he turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? When I entered your house, you did not give me water for my feet, but she has bathed them with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You did not give me a kiss, but she has not ceased kissing my feet since the time I entered. You did not anoint my head with oil, but she anointed my feet with ointment. So I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven because she has shown great love. But the one to whom little is forgiven, loves little." He said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." The others at table said to themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" But he said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."

Afterward he journeyed from one town and village to another, preaching and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom of God. Accompanying him were the Twelve and some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, Susanna, and many others who provided for them out of their resources.

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you responded to someone who humbly acknowledged behaving badly.

2. Jesus showed forgiveness in the Gospel. How have you experienced God's forgiveness in your life?

3. Describe a time when a woman taught you what forgiveness, love or humility meant.

Family and children's question:

Jesus upbraids Simon the Pharisee for harshly judging the woman in today's Gospel. Talk about the times when you prejudged someone and your judgement wasn't correct..

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

The robber stuck a gun in the man's back, but the man turned suddenly, applied a judo grip, and flung the robber across the alley. Then he pounced on the robber and began to wipe him out. He blackened his eyes, broke his jaw, fractured his ribs, and broke both his arms. Finally the robber cried in desperation, "Hey Mister, aren't you never gonna call a cop?" All our human efforts to live are like the efforts of a robber trying to steal time from inevitable death. Every morning when we wake up just reminds us that we have lost one day of our life and have travelled one day closer to our death.

Today's Gospel narrates how Jesus stops the funeral procession of a dead young man and brings him back to life. Death does not have any existence in itself. It is just the absence of life. When God the source of life crosses the way of death, the latter has to yield to the force of life. The people who witnessed how death was driven away by Jesus by raising the young man to life began to experience the presence of God.

From the human point of view, our life is nothing but a journey from birth to death. But if we allow Jesus to meet us he is ready to stop death to change its direction towards life. It is our choice to allow our life's journey to experience death or life. Let us stop for Jesus and join the people of today's Gospel to experience life and God's presence among us.

Next weekend is our Parish Feast weekend. Let us make our Feast weekend a spiritual event by praying the NOVENA to St. Thomas More every day. You can find the novena prayer in this bulletin. At the 9:00 am Mass we will pray this Novena Prayer from Friday June 3rd onwards. We pray it every day for a particular intention. Please join with us in praying this novena for you and your family starting this Sunday.

I extend a hearty welcome to all of you to join the celebrations by participating in any of the various feast events. Friday June10th at 7:00 pm we have the Dinner Dance party-- \$25 a person. Saturday June 11th after the 5:00 pm Mass Parish Luau Party - a fun filled evening for the whole family. Sunday June 12th after every Mass we have a pancake breakfast. It is our parish family time.

Catholics for Freedom of Religion

Cautiously Optimistic:

The Little Sisters of the Poor were hoping for a resolution to their years-long fight for religious freedom. Instead, they did get the second best thing: The U.S. Supreme Court's unanimous agreement that the government needs to change its approach to the ACA contraception/abortion mandate. The justices sent the nuns' case back to the lower courts, where it hopes a better solution will be reached for religious groups like Little Sisters of the Poor, Priests For Life, and other religious organizations.

In the meantime, the Court delivered a huge win on one point: the nuns and others will be shielded from the millions of dollars in government fines in the process. "No one - not nuns, not business owners, or everyday Americans - should be faced with the choice of violating their beliefs or paying ridiculous penalties to exercise them," said Family Research Council. (frc.org, 5/16/16)

Small Victory:

The Department of Homeland Security has announced that it plans to replace the term **"freedom of worship"** on all naturalization materials with **"freedom of religion"**. "It's one of those small, incremental victories," said Sen. James Lankford. "I've often heard the president talk about freedom of worship...that means if you have a faith, you can go to church and practice your faith if it doesn't affect your daily life. That's not what we have. **We have the free exercise of religion**. That is, if you have a faith, you can live it anywhere you choose as an American." (dailysignal.com, 4/7/16)


