Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 26, 2016

Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1 Kings 19:16B, 19-21

Psalm 16: 1-2, 5, 7-8, 9-10, 11

Galatians 5:1, 13-18

Luke 9: 51-62

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

When the days for Jesus' being taken up were fulfilled, he resolutely determined to journey to Jerusalem, and he sent messengers ahead of him. On the way they entered a Samaritan village to prepare for his reception there, but they would not welcome him because the destination of his journey was Jerusalem.

When the disciples James and John saw this they asked, "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?"

Jesus turned and rebuked them, and they journeyed to another village.

As they were proceeding on their journey someone said to him, "I will follow you wherever you go."

Jesus answered him,

"Foxes have dens and birds of the sky have nests, but the Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head."

And to another he said, "Follow me."

But he replied, "Lord, let me go first and bury my father." But he answered him, "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God."

And another said, "I will follow you, Lord, but first let me say farewell to my family at home."

To him Jesus said, "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you had to put what you were doing aside to answer a call.
2. How has following Jesus meant you had to sacrifice something?
3. Relate a time when you had to make a change of direction in your life.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you wanted to "get back at" someone but you were talked out of it by a wise person.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Religion Teacher: In our lesson today we talked about the burnt offerings in the Old Testament. Why don't we have burnt offerings today?

Student: On account of air pollution.

We live in a world of opinions in which the same question may be answered in multiple ways. It is small wonder that we experience confusion in our world and our commitments at times are met with many challenges.

Today's Gospel invites us to take a journey to grow as a person from the world of opinions to commitment. Jesus asks his disciples what people say about him. Upon hearing their replies, Jesus asks who they say he is. They were happy to share their experience of Jesus as Christ (Messiah) from what they have seen in him and heard from him. But that is only one half of who Jesus is. Jesus invited them to see the other half of how he will embrace a shameful and suffering death. He admonishes them to commit themselves to be with him in following him even amidst the suffering.

To be a disciple of Jesus is not just to have an opinion about him. Rather it is to commit to a relationship with him at all times-- happy as well as challenging times.

When we observe current young families, that role is so different. The father is now a partner in all family activities; he is a helpmate in all child rearing activities; he helps with housework chores and is perhaps even a coach for a child's sport activities. Probably because so many more wives are in the workplace, the father has become far more visible and therefore more active.

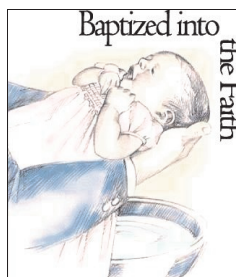
