



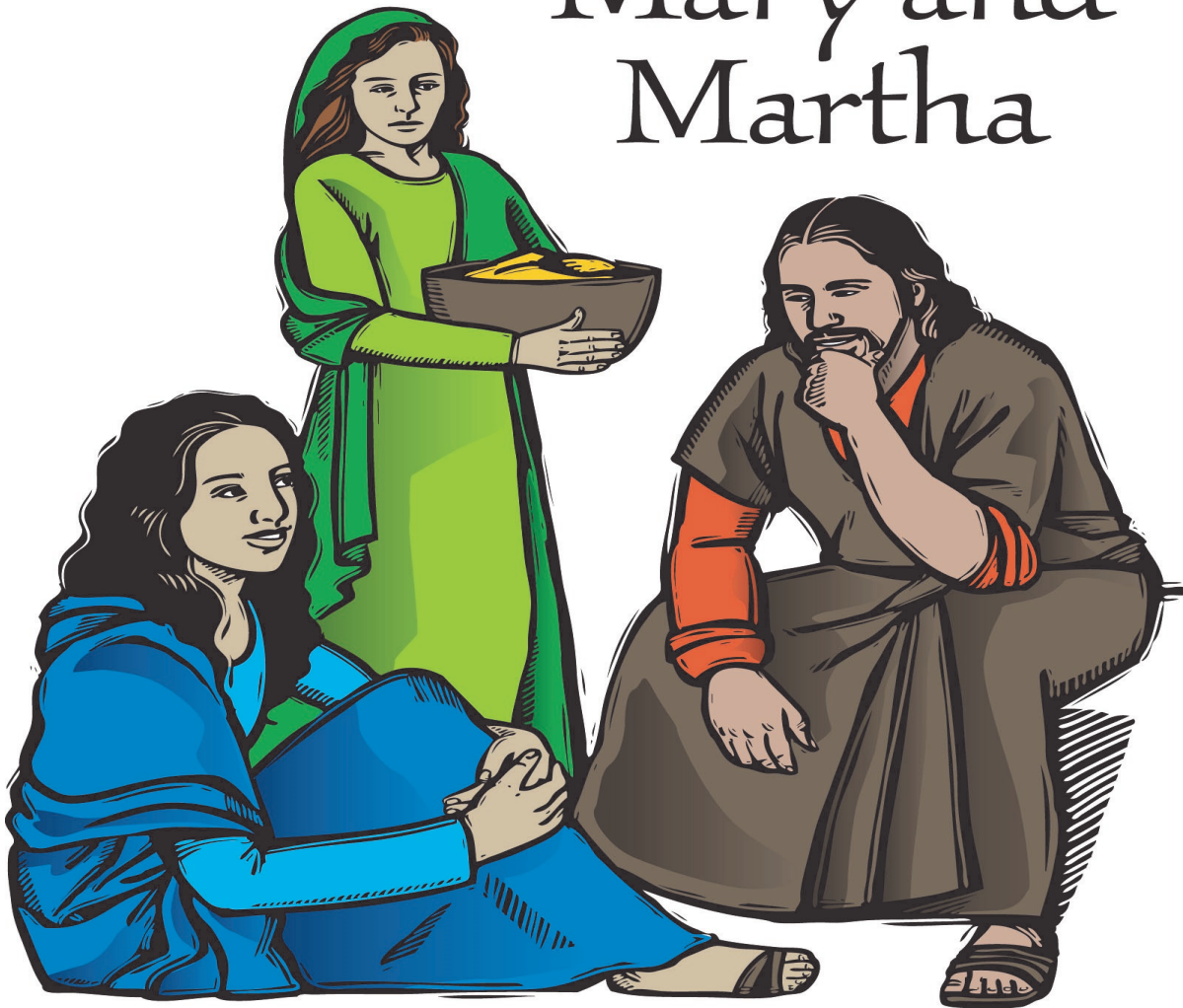

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 24, 2016
Seventeenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Genesis 18:20-32
Psalm
Colossians
Luke 11:1-13

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray just as John taught his disciples." He said to them, "When you pray, say: Father, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread and forgive us our sins for we ourselves forgive everyone in debt to us, and do not subject us to the final test."

And he said to them, "Suppose one of you has a friend to whom he goes at midnight and says, 'Friend, lend me three loaves of bread, for a friend of mine has arrived at my house from a journey and I have nothing to offer him,' and he says in reply from within, 'Do not bother me; the door has already been locked and my children and I are already in bed. I cannot get up to give you anything.' I tell you, if he does not get up to give the visitor the loaves because of their friendship, he will get up to give him whatever he needs because of his persistence.

"And I tell you, ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks, receives; and the one who seeks, finds; and to the one who knocks, the door will be opened. What father among you would hand his son a snake when he asks for a fish? Or hand him a scorpion when he asks for an egg? If you then, who are wicked, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him?"

Focus Questions:

1. How easy or difficult is it for you to pray "not my will but yours be done"?
2. Recall how you felt when God answered one of your prayers.
3. For whom or what are you praying these days?

Family and children's question:

Each day pray the Lord's Prayer slowly, attentive to the words you are praying.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Two men drove their cars toward each other on a narrow street – neither could pass. One leaned out and shouted, “I never back up for a stupid!”

“I always do!” shouted the other man shifting into reverse. Yielding does not mean losing, nor gaining means winning. The action is valued from its meaning we attach to it.

Comparing today's Gospel with last week's Gospel of the Good Samaritan would help us understand it better. The Good Samaritan was praised by Jesus for what he did to the wounded person. Mary is complemented by Jesus for sitting at Jesus's feet for doing nothing. Doing or non-doing does not have any value in itself. The value is in the intention of the doer. The doer makes the doing or non-doing meaningful.

The Good Samaritan's mercy made him help the wounded person. But in today's Gospel Martha's anxiety makes her complain to Jesus that she is left working alone without help from Mary. Jesus purifies her motive of act by making Mary's disposition as an example. Mary is not simply sitting at the feet of Jesus in order to excuse herself from helping her sister. By telling that Mary has chosen the better part Jesus wants to explain to us that doing work like Martha or sitting (non-doing) at the feet of Jesus like Mary has to be inspired by a pure motive, love for someone.

Jesus explains that if an act or non-act is inspired by Godly virtue or love of God, then that act would make the doer's life joyful and meaningful. On the other hand if an act or non-act is done without inspiration then all that one does would be just a useless perspiration, anxiety and burden. Let us sit at the feet of Jesus like Mary to be inspired by Jesus. Let all we do like Martha be an outcome of what Jesus inspires within us. Let the motives of all our acts or non-acts be a joyful living arising from the inspiration. May all our perspiration be touched by God's inspiration and become blessings from God.

Marching on to the Golden Jubilee: We will soon enter into the 50th year of being St. Thomas More Parish-Family. In December of 2016 we will begin the Golden Jubilee year and complete it December of 2017. It is an important milestone in our Parish History, an occasion worthy of celebration.

On July 1st I randomly invited over 60 people representing various ministries and volunteer groups to speak about the spiritual renewal and Sanctuary renovation. Participants enthusiastically shared their suggestions to celebrate the Golden Jubilee both spiritually and socially. I am trying to put together a steering committee to come up with celebration plans from what people have suggested to me both personally and in the meetings. You are welcome to make your suggestions, the ways and means of celebrating it. Please bring your ideas to make it a memorable event to all of us especially to our younger generation.... Let us celebrate in such a way to engrave this event with some renovations spiritually and physically left as symbols to invite the forthcoming generation.

Our annual Golf Outing, will be on Monday September 12th at Rock Hill Golf course in Manorville. All golfers welcome. If you are not a golfer you can support this parish fund raising event by buying raffles. You will get raffle tickets in the mail. Soon they will be sold in the Narthex too. Tickets are \$10 each or 3 for \$20. This bulletin carries more information. Our Golf committee is working hard for the success of it. Let us support them in 'sharing the spirit of Love' and in memory of our beloved Pastor Msgr. Midura.

New assignment: Bishop Murphy has assigned Fr. Harold Noviello to be a chaplain at St. Catherine's Nursing Home in Smithtown beginning August 1, 2016. We thank him for his ministry in our parish. We assure our prayers and wish him well in his new ministry.

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION



Artists Threatened with Fines & Jail:

*** A Phoenix, AZ, city ordinance seeks to force local artists to use their talents to promote same-sex weddings by threatening them with \$2500/day fines and 6 months in jail. Owners of Bush & Nib Studio want to honor God through their art and business by specializing in hand painting, hand lettering and calligraphy for events including weddings.

Alliance Defending Freedom filed a pre-enforcement challenge to the Phoenix city code stating: "The government must allow artists the freedom to make personal decisions ... (an artist) isn't required to express all viewpoints. It's unjust, unnecessary, and unlawful to force an artist to create against her will and intimidate her into silence." (dailysignal.com, 5/16/16)

*** A new appeal was filed in the long-running case of Christian bakers, Melissa & Aaron Klein, who refused to violate their Christian beliefs by creating a wedding cake for a same-sex couple. The Klein's were assessed a \$135,000 fine plus required rehabilitation classes.

According to court records, OR officials overseeing the case stated publicly that people with such beliefs need to be "rehabilitated." The latest brief argues, "It unlawfully compels two law-abiding Oregon citizens, the Klein's, to devote their time and talent to create art destined for use in events conveying messages that contradict their deeply held religious beliefs." The brief further argues that the state cannot compel people to "violate their consciences in the name of rehabilitating religious dissenters." (wnd.com, 4/30/16)

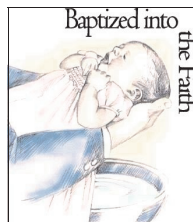
