Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 31, 2016
Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Ecclesiastes 1:2; 2:21-23
Psalm 90:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14, 17
Colossians 3:1-5, 9-11
Luke 12:13-21

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus,

"Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him,

"Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd.

"Take care to guard against all greed,

for though one may be rich,

one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest.

He asked himself, 'What shall I do,

for I do not have space to store my harvest?'

And he said, 'This is what I shall do:

I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones.

There I shall store all my grain and other goods

and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you,

you have so many good things stored up for many years,

rest, eat, drink, be merry!""

But God said to him,

'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

Focus Questions:

- 1. Share a time when you felt God was moving you to simplify your life.
- 2. Relate a time when material goods failed to satisfy you..
- 3. In our culture, our value is often seen in having it all. What is enough for you?

Family and children's question:

This week go through closets and give away what you haven't worn or used to those who need it.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

John: "Did you see how pleased Mrs. Smith looked when I told her that she didn't look a day older than her daughter?" Don: "I didn't notice Mrs. Smith.... I was too busy watching the expression on her daughter's face. She was not at all pleased." Words have power. They can hurt or please people. They can give hope and create a new future or enrage fury and destroy the present condi-

In today's Gospel Jesus teaches us to pray. Prayer is not mere utterance of words or making some sounds by letting air through the vocal cords. Rather as Jesus explains in the prayer of 'Our Father', we express in our prayers what we want God to do for us. We ask God to work for us as if God Himself would work in us. We plead that our will becomes God's will; God's will be done in us as it is done in God's place, Heaven. Thus prayer is our will expressed in our words by which we let ourselves to become God's will and God's act.

In the second part of the Gospel Jesus tells a story. Prayer is not a one-time petition. It is a conscious commitment to God to let God alone and to let God's will alone be done in everything that happens to us. When prayer request is delayed or unanswered our commitment should not be slackened or changed to some other person or some other power. The power of the prayer does not contain in the words or in the numbers of time we pray. It comes from one's commitment to God in faith and one's openness to God and God alone. Let us, like the disciples of today's Gospel, ask Jesus to teach us how to pray and how to commit ourselves to God's power and God's will alone.

We wish him all the best in his ministry among us.

Religious Freedom Legislation - Status:*** U.S. House of Representatives: The First Amendment Defense Act, a bill designed to protect individuals and nonprofit organizations from being discriminated against because of their religious beliefs, will get a hearing before the House on July 12. Among other things, the bill's protections would include religious schools tax-exempt status and prevent federal employees from being fired for holding traditional views on marriage. Former Atlanta Fire Chief, Kevin Cochran, will testify since he was fired after publishing a men's devotional book for his church that included a Christian perspective on marriage and sexuality. *** Mississippi: A federal judge blocked a Mississippi law, passed by the legislature and signed by the governor, that protects citizens with religious beliefs objecting to same-sex marriage. "If judges (legislating from the bench) can strip American citizens of the free exercise of religion in public, that means faith in general is in peril - ," said Abraham Hamilton, policy analyst. 
