Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 7, 2015
Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Wisdom 18: 6-9
Psalm 33: 1, 12, 18-19, 20-22
Hebrews 11: 1-2, 8-19
Luke 12:35-40

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples:

“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks.

Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have the servants recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants.

Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.”

Focus Questions:

1. How do you use the gifts God has given to you?
2. What is the treasure of your life?
3. What has changed in your life because of your faith?

Family question

Jesus tells his disciples not to be afraid. What are you most afraid of? How does your faith in Jesus help you overcome this fear?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Mike: I always do my hardest work before breakfast.

Sandy: What's that?

Mike: Getting up.

It is always hard to get up from that into which we have comfortably settled. No one willingly welcomes the change. It is pleasing to continue the convenient status quo

In today's readings Paul invites us in the second reading to get up and "put on the new self", to walk away from our convenient self to a renewed self which is nothing but God's image after which we are created.

Jesus explains in Today's Gospel story how easily we lose the real richness of living the present by saving material possessions for the future. If we don't live the present valuably we cannot meaningfully save anything for the future. When we fail to live the meaning and reality of life at present, as the first reading says, all our future will appear to be vanity of vanities, empty and meaningless. Paul invites us to live the person of Christ who is hidden within us. When we allow Christ's meaning to live in us, our life will be ever new. Let us join with Paul and say, "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me." (Letter to Galatians 2:20).

Let us not waste the present for the unsecured and unknown future. Let the well-lived present be the strong foundation for the future. May Christ be the power and meaning of present living; may Christ become the strong foundation of our future.

7x7 = 49 + 1 = 50 - Golden Jubilee: St. Thomas More was started a week before Christmas of 1967. In December of 2016 we will begin the Golden Jubilee year and complete it in December of 2017.

The Book of Leviticus, the third book of the Holy Bible, speaks about the Jubilee Year, "You shall count seven weeks of years—seven times seven years—such that the seven weeks of years amount to forty-nine years..... You shall treat this fiftieth year as sacred..... You shall proclaim liberty in the land for all its inhabitants..... In this year of jubilee, then, each of you shall return to your own property." God brought His people out of the slavery from Egypt and settled them in the Promised Land of Cana. After living there for 50 years they messed its economy and ecology; inequality and injustice crept in and was strongly rooted among them. So God offers them a New Beginning at the end of 7x7 = 49 years. The 50th year is the Jubilee year to have a New Beginning to end the human mess and start afresh in God's Order.

Let us also declare a New Beginning for ourselves at St. Thomas More in God's Grace. We started in December of 1967, (7x7 =) 49 years ago. Now let us declare the beginning of the Jubilee year to renew ourselves, to invigorate ourselves in God's Grace.

My Jubilee Prayer: I pray every day for the families of our parish that we all grow in the Spirit of the Lord with the strength from the 50 year-tradition of St. Thomas More. My passionate cry to God every day is to turn all of us as His Powerful witnesses to welcome and embrace all especially the estranged younger generations to God's rich gift of life. I pray fervently every day that God will work through us to bring them back to celebrate life with us more often. I strongly believe that God's seeds are still alive in their hearts. May this Golden Jubilee be the right moment for the seeds to germinate. May this 50th year renewal and renovation be an occasion we provide God to do that through us. Let us celebrate in such a way to engrave this event with renovations spiritually and physically as symbols to invite the forthcoming generation.

My summer visit to India: I am leaving for India on July 31st to visit my mom and be with her and my brothers' families for the whole month. See you all in September.

Welcome to Fr. Alexander Mariadass: While I am away Fr. Alexander Mariadass, (Fr. Alex) will be here helping us in the parish. He is a priest for 10 years from the Diocese of Coimbatore, India. He got his Licentiate in Sacred Liturgy and will begin his doctorate in Missiology, in October in the Urban Pontifical University, Rome, Italy. We welcome him. We wish him all the best in his ministry among us.

California Threatens Religious Freedom of Catholic Colleges:



The freedom of Catholic and other faith-based colleges in CA to operate in accord with their religious missions is being threatened by recent legislation that advances the states LGBT lobby. The bill's primary goal is to prevent faith-based colleges that receive state funds from enforcing codes of conduct that reflect the colleges' religious beliefs about sexual identity and the confining of marriage to male-female relationships.

If signed into law, this bill opens religious colleges to unjust litigation and makes them unable to accept state grants used to help pay students' tuition. It would eliminate the ability of these colleges to operate under any faith-based principles and represents an attack on religious freedom that promotes and protects a radical gender ideology that Pope Francis has warned is a danger to society. 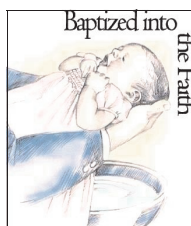
