Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 14, 2015 Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 38: 4-6, 8-10 Psalm 40: 2, 3, 4, 18 Hebrews 12: 1-4 Luke 12:49-53

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing! There is a baptism with which I must be baptized, and how great is my anguish until it is accomplished!

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Game Warden: Fishing?

Man without license: No, drowning worms.

There arises suddenly an unexpected situation in life when we have to come up with some smart answers and solutions to cope with the situation.

Today's readings focus on faith which will keep us ever prepared to face any kind of situation. Anything but faith will only end up in disappointment and frustration. We are like Abraham, travelers in the journey of life. We must have faith in our travelling and not lose our focus on the destination. In life's journey nothing is permanent; everything is subject to change. Our faith in God will give us the experience of God who is providing and travelling with us. We will not focus on any particular situation to hold us back because of its apparent pleasure or to overwhelm us because of its burden.

As Jesus instructs us in the Gospel, we will be like the servants who are ready for the arrival of the master. If we lose focus on the master's arrival, we may be tempted to handle life as if it were in our control. Thus we will not be ready or prepared to face the unexpected.

Let us pray that we have the heart of the servant to serve life both for us and others. Our life is a journey; let us travel; let us not stay and sink in our convenient self. Let us allow God's providence to lead us.

Golden Jubilee, 50 years young and growing new every day: What St. Paul wrote to his Church in Ephesus fits for our Church, "..... you are fellow citizens with the holy ones and members of the household of God built upon the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the capstone. Through him the whole structure is held together and grows into a temple sacred in the Lord; in him you also are being built together into a dwelling place of God in the Spirit." (Ephesians 2:19-22) In December of 2017 we will be 50 years young as a Church built upon the foundations of our foregone generations having Christ as our Cornerstone holding us all together in 'Sharing the Spirit of Love'.

Our Jubilee Prayer and celebration should continue and reflect the tradition of our 50 years life of St. Thomas More. Our passionate cry to God every day must be that we become His Powerful witnesses to welcome and embrace all, especially the estranged younger generations, to God's rich gift of life. This is what our forefathers and mothers did for us to provide us with the gift of faith and the great symbols of worship and a place of worship which brings together our past and present in order to design our future in God's providence.

The Sanctuary especially needs to be renovated. The tabernacle, the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus, is hidden. At the death of Jesus the thick veil dividing the people from God's presence was torn and God's Holy of Holies was exposed to the people (Mt 27:51; Mk 15:38). Our Church still has the wall between the presence and the gathering of the congregation. Our sanctuary space is so narrow that during weddings, con-celebrations and regular Sundays when all Eucharistic ministers are gathered, we are too congested and do not have enough space to move around. Our sanctuary has four different levels causing tripping and stumbling. Our Parking lot also needs to be repaved. I explained these needs to

people of different groups who welcome the need for renovations. I wrote to the diocese expressing these needs and I was requested to do some preliminary studies of what needs to be done how we can afford them.

Our annual Golf Outing will be on Monday September 12th at Rock Hill Golf course in Manorville. All golfers are welcome. If you are not a golfer you can support this parish fundraising event by buying raffles. You are invited to St. Thomas More Beach Mass and Picnic. Please remember to mark your calendar; September 18th, the date at Otto Schubert Beach, Nissequogue, starting with Mass at noon. Picnic follows mass with burgers, hot dogs, chips, beverages.

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF **RELIGION**

California Threatens Religious Freedom of **Catholic Colleges:**

The freedom of Catholic and other faith-based colleges in CA to operate in accord with their religious missions is being threatened by recent legislation that advances the states LGBT lobby. The bill's primary goal is to

prevent faith-based colleges that receive state funds from enforcing codes of conduct that reflect the colleges' religious beliefs about sexual identity and the confining of marriage to male-female relationships.

If signed into law, this bill opens religious colleges to unjust litigation and makes them unable to accept state grants used to help pay students' tuition. It would eliminate these colleges' ability to operate under any faith-based principles and represents an attack on religious freedom that promotes and protects a radical gender ideology that Pope Francis has warned is a danger to society. 


