Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 21, 2015 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 66: 18-22 Psalm 117: 1,2 Hebrews 12: 5-7, 11-13 Luke 13:22-30

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus passed through towns and villages, teaching as he went and making his way to Jerusalem.

Someone asked him,

"Lord, will only a few people be saved?"

He answered them,

"Strive to enter through the narrow gate, for many, I tell you, will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough. After the master of the house has arisen and locked the door, then will you stand outside knocking and saying, 'Lord, open the door for us.'

He will say to you in reply,

'I do not know where you are from.

And you will say,

'We ate and drank in your company and you taught in our streets.'

Then he will say to you,

'I do not know where you are from. Depart from me, all you evildoers!'

And there will be wailing and grinding of teeth when you see Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob and all the prophets in the kingdom of God and you yourselves cast out. And people will come from the east and the west and from the north and the south and will recline at table in the kingdom of God. For behold, some are last who will be first, and some are first who will be last."

Focus Questions:

- 1. When you hear Jesus say enter through the narrow gate, are you encouraged or discouraged?
- 2. Describe a time when you witnessed someone who was judged too quickly.
- 3. Each day presents us with new opportunities to learn from Jesus, to do what God wants of us. What do you do to stay open to learn from Jesus?

Family question

Name a time when you took the easy way out, instead of the best way, the way through the narrow gate.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Young man: I request, could you please lend me one dollar?

Senior: I'm little deaf in this ear; go around to the other one.

Young man: Could you lend me five dollars?

Senior: Lend you what? Young man: Five dollars.

Senior: Oh, you had better go back to the one-dollar ear.

Though excuses may seem to help you escape problems for the moment, they would only end up bringing more harm as time goes by. Excuses may seem to make life less burdensome for a moment but they cannot offer life.

In today's Gospel Jesus instructs his disciples to dare life beyond all excuses; nothing should hinder them from living it. When we choose to live the life offered by Jesus we cannot allow any person, not even our own parents or family, to stop us embracing it. Pure and original life gifted by Jesus is worth living even at the cost of going against one's own family or friends.

In this sense Jesus' gift of life may seem like causing more trouble in family. It may feel like walking on fire. It may seem like Jesus is causing destructive fire or disturbing divisions. But, as the second reading suggests, the life offered by Jesus is worth this trouble and division for the sake of the joy that lies before us. Because excuses make many holes through which we begin to leak life every day, by these words Jesus invites us to a radical commitment without allowing any excuse.

Monday August 15th is the Solemn Feast of the Assumption of our Blessed Mother Mary. Her assumption is the demonstration by God that even death cannot end our life. It sounds ironic. As long as we measure our life in terms of body or in terms of the relationship we build in this world while we live, then logically our life ends when we die. But Mary's assumption says that God has a purpose for each of us which is to be with him forever, in heaven. In Mary God has demonstrated his purpose for each of us is to be in his presence forever. August 15th is not a Holy Day of Obligation this year. We will not have a Vigil Mass on the 14th evening but we will have two masses on August 15th, the Solemn Feast of the Assumption, at 9:00 am and 7:00 pm.

Golden Jubilee, 50 years of EMMANUEL - 'God With Us'. Psalm 127 begins with these words, "Unless the LORD build the house, they labor in vain who build. Unless the LORD guard the city, in vain does the guard keep watch." Our Golden Jubilee expresses the same sentiments. It is God who builds us and enables our growth as the Church of St. Thomas More to celebrate this Jubilee in "sharing the Spirit of Love". But for God's work, we would merely be a lifeless building and a meaningless name. But ours is a 50year young Church built upon the foundations of our foregone generations with Christ as our cornerstone holding us all together and continuing to make us grow in 'Sharing the Spirit of Love'.

The Sanctuary especially needs to be renovated. The tabernacle, the Eucharistic Presence of Jesus, is hidden. At the death of Jesus the thick veil dividing the people from God's presence was torn and God's Holy of Holies was exposed to the people (Mt 27:51; Mk 15:38). Our Church still has the wall between the Eucharistic presence and the gathering of the congregation. Our sanctuary space is so narrow that when all Eucharistic ministers are gathered during weddings, concelebrations and regular Sundays, we are too congested and do not have enough space to move around. Our sanctuary has four different levels causing tripping and stumbling. Our Parking lot also needs to be repaved. I explained these needs to people of different groups who welcome the need for renovations. I wrote to the diocese expressing these needs and I was requested to do some preliminary studies of what needs to be done and how we can afford them.

Our annual Golf Outing will be on Monday September 12th at Rock Hill Golf course in Manorville. All golfers are welcome. If you are not a golfer you can support this parish fundraising event by buying raffles.

You are invited to St. Thomas More Beach Mass and Picnic. Please remember to mark your calendar; September 18th, the date at Otto Schubert Beach, Nissequogue, starting with Mass at noon. Troubling Trends - Part 1:




A Catholic employee at Macy's, Flushing, NY, was fired for his religious beliefs about gender. Javier Chavez, senior store detective of 26 years, responded to a complaint from a mother and daughter OF about a man using the Women's Restroom.

His superiors told him Macy's new policy is that men identifying as women may now use this restroom. Chavez said he would enforce the new policy but believed the policy was wrong based on his Catholic faith and the Bible. He was then fired based on his stated opinions and beliefs. - * A 15-year alumni office employee, Gigi Kurtz, at Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, a Jesuit University, was suspended from her job and accused of a "hate crime" following a conversation with some students in which she defended Church teaching on human sexuality. "I was accused of a hate-crime because I did not agree with the LGBT opinion on transgenderism and for sharing Catholic morality on the subject," said Ms. Kurtz. The Freedom of Conscience Defense Fund defended Ms. Kurtz and she was eventually reinstated without an apology. (cardinalnewmansociety.org, 7/21/16)
- * The owner of Cedar Springs Christian Store in Knoxville, TN, learned the advertisement she had paid for in the Knoxville News Sentinel did not appear because it contained an "offensive" word -Christian. After hundreds of complaints, the newspaper apologized saying there was a technology issue in their system that flagged the word "Christian" as offensive. This has been corrected. (washingtontimes.com, 7/29/16; knoxmercuryw.com, 7/29/16)


