Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 11, 2015
Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Exodus 32:7-11, 13-14
Psalm 51: 3-4, 12-13, 17, 19
1 Timothy 1:12-17
Luke 15:1-32

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying, "This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable.

"What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.' I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who Repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance.

"Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them, 'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Focus Questions:

1. Recall a time when you experienced God's mercy in your life.
2. Which of these 3 parables touches you the most? Why?
3. Recall a time when you felt separated from God and God sought you out.

Family question:

Tell a story about forgiveness that inspired you to act differently.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Customer: I've come back to buy that television I was looking at yesterday.

Salesman: That's good. May I ask what was the one dominating thing that made you want this set?

Customer: My wife.

In today's Gospel Jesus is like the salesman, asking us the question, "what is that one important thing you want to have at the cost of setting aside parents, family and even your own self?" We may ask Jesus if there can be anything at all to be chosen at the cost of losing our own parents, family and our own dear self. Jesus responds that following him as his disciples is very costly. The true follower is required to pay the very high price of his family or his very self.

In Jesus's words 'following' or 'to be his disciple' means a total commitment. Following Jesus makes the disciple never more to be him/herself. As Paul would say, 'It is not the follower lives but the master, Jesus lives in him/her.' When one gives oneself totally and fully mingles with Jesus, then that union with Jesus would reshape all one's views and values of life. It is no more the disciple but Jesus in the disciple that becomes the measure of life.

The followers of Jesus use no more their own scale of evaluation but that of Jesus. God's standard is their standard. They interpret and understand the reality and the relationship not in the usual human way but in Jesus's way. Unless the follower denies the regular and human way of viewing and valuing reality and raises up to the way of Jesus, his or her commitment and following would not be a complete one. Today's Gospel invites us to view and value every person and thing by Jesus's standard. Let us pray that God opens our eyes to see as Jesus sees and commit as Jesus demands.

Golden Jubilee – 50 years of Sharing the Spirit of Love: What St. Peter wrote about his Church in the first century is true of our parish. ["... you have purified yourselves by obedience to the truth for sincere mutual love, love one another intensely from a \[pure\] heart. You have been born anew,](#) not from perishable but from imperishable seed, through the living and abiding word of God." (Peter 1:22-23). We are called by His Truth and are kept growing together by His Love. It is not the number of years but the strength of the divine truth and the intensity of God's love lived among us which is celebrated as our Golden Jubilee. Let us pray that the Truth and Love of God will spread and strengthen our parish for many more years of 'sharing the spirit of Love'. Let us pass to our forthcoming generations what we have cherished for 50 years. Let the Golden Jubilee celebration be an occasion to try our best to bring the next generation to the same spiritual realization.

Two groups of peoples have volunteered as steering committees to plan and celebrate our Golden Jubilee both with spiritual and structural renovations. They have come up with beautiful suggestions and willingness to coordinate the celebrative events. I will share with you as the year of Golden Jubilee begins to unfold in December of 2016. Viva St. Thomas More!






Youth Ministry Corner

CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION

Catholics For Freedom of Religion



The U.S. Department of Education has issued guidelines explaining students' religious liberties.

*** You can pray, read your Bible or other religious material, and talk about your faith at**

school.

A 7-year-old boy at Desert Rose Elementary School in Palmdale, California, read an encouraging note and Bible verse that his mother had packed into his lunch bag to his friends at lunch time. Soon, many students were asking for copies of the notes which included short stories from the Bible. However, when one little girl said, "Teacher, this is the most beautiful story I've ever seen," the boy was reprimanded twice by his teacher in front of the whole class and told to stop talking about religion or sharing his mother's notes. He went home in tears.

A letter to the district from Liberty Counsel said, "... it is clear that the actions of the district's staff, in prohibiting voluntary student religious expression during non-instructional time, then completely banning such student expression from school property entirely, and finally, calling the police to report the same, are simply unconstitutional."

The district has ignored this letter.

Football Coach Joe Kennedy, fired from Bremerton School District, Washington, for saying a brief, personal prayer at the 50-yard line after games since 2008, has just filed a lawsuit. "When the school district fired Coach Kennedy for praying, they engaged in explicit religious discrimination, violating the First Amendment and Title VII of the Civil Rights Act," said First Liberty Senior Counsel.
