



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 18, 2015 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Amos 8:4-7 Psalm 113: 1-2, 4-6, 7-8 1 Timothy 2:1-8 Luke 16:1-13

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.'

The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.'

He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

Focus Questions:

- 1. What gives you security?
- 2. How does Jesus's statement about not being able to serve two masters challenge you?
- 3. What steps have you taken lately to make God the center of your life?

Family question:

Talk about what distracts you from spending time with God.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The man in the repair shop said, "Here it is, Mr. Wilson. Your lawnmower is now in perfect condition. Just one precaution, however, don't ever lend it to a neighbor."

"That is just the trouble," said Mr. Wilson, "I am the neighbor."

Today's Gospel invites us to check and see how most of the time our problems are self-caused. God waits, searches for us to come to grips with our original God-given self. Jesus narrates three stories. In the first story God is the shepherd looking for the lost sheep to bring it back to His fold, to be fed and to grow in the Shepherd's loving care. In the second story God is the woman searching for the lost coin with broom and light in hand. In the third story God is the father waiting for the lost son to come back and join the family, and at the same time begging the older son to accept and celebrate the younger son's return.

All the stories portray how humans can easily lose themselves and go astray and how God is searching for the lost ones (sheep and coin). God does not force us to come to Him but patiently waits for us to come back to Him (lost son) and begs us not to be hard on judging others but to be appreciatively merciful to join and celebrate life wherever and whenever it is found. In the year of mercy let us join the merciful attitude of God and take time to return to our original God-given self. Also let us be merciful towards others, not to judge but to encourage life in them.



Catholics For Freedom of Religion



"Free to Speak" - What the U.S. Department of Education says about public school students' religious liberties:

* You can organize prayer groups and religious clubs, and announce your meetings.

Two years ago, Liz Loverde, a L.I., NY high school student, submitted an application requesting the school recognize the "Dare To Believe" after-school club she wanted to form using school facilities just as 30 other school clubs did. The stated purpose of "Dare To Believe" was:

- "To strengthen one another as believers in Christ
- To study God's Word, the Bible, and apply it in your life
- To serve the community as the hands and feet of Jesus"

But the school refused to recognize the club simply because of its religious nature.

First Liberty Institute intervened on Liz's behalf, and school officials then complied with federal law and officially recognized "Dare To Believe."

As students prepare to go back to school for the 2016-17 school year, they may think there is nothing they can do to make a positive change in the world and protect their freedom of religion. But as one Long Island girl proved, when one person dared to believe, that's enough. (firstliberty.org, 8/5/16)


