



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 2, 2015 **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time** Habakkuk 1:2-3; 2:2-4 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 2 Timothy 1:6-8, 13-14 Luke 17:5-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith." The Lord replied,

"If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"Who among you would say to your servant who has just come in from plowing or tending sheep in the field, 'Come here immediately and take your place at table'? Would he not rather say to him,

'Prepare something for me to eat. Put on your apron and wait on me while I eat and drink. You may eat and drink when I am finished'? Is he grateful to that servant because he did what was commanded? So should it be with you. When you have done all you have been commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants; we have done what we were obliged to do.""

Focus Questions:

- 1. How would you describe the size of your faith today?
- 2. Describe your reaction when you were asked to do more than you really wanted to do.
- 3. Relate a time when you struggled between doing what God wants and doing what you wanted.

Family question:

What can you do as a family to increase your faith?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Man: Just look at that young person with the short hair and blue jeans. Is it a boy or a girl?

Bystander: It's a girl; she is my daughter.

Man: Oh, please forgive me, sir. I had no idea you were her father.

Bystander: I'm not. I'm her mother.

How do we look at people or things around us?

In today's Gospel Jesus narrates a story to open our eyes. The story is about this rich man who did not notice poor Lazarus at his door steps, but who began to see him across the unsurpassable chasm. Through the character of the rich man, the Gospel introduces us to our own blindness and invites us to see the truth of life.

Most often we see conveniently and not clearly. When we are engrossed in ourselves we will be blind even to the most obvious. If we choose to be locked within our own comfort zone like the rich man, we will not be able to see anything but ourselves, even though the best of the best may lie just in front of our eyes. Nothing will matter to us except our own individual selfish world and the self-justification to live in it.

Today's Gospel challenges us to come out of our comfort zone, our own convenient philosophy and our habitual way of perceiving others and life as such. It invites us in the story of poor Lazarus and the rich man, to see the truth and the reality of life to be bigger than our own convenient convictions.

Our appreciation goes to the Columbiettes, who with the help of the Knights of Columbus, ran a food drive on Saturday, September 17th. They filled our parish pantry with over 2500 pounds of food. Thanks to the Columbiettes and the generous donors.

Shameful Silence by media on Christian genocide:

The American Center for Law & Justice (ACLJ) is calling upon the U.N. to fight and protect Christians and other minorities from genocide at the hands of ISIS. In addition, on Aug. 30, the ACLJ filed suit against the U.S. State Dept. after they failed to answer a request about what action the administration is taking to respond to, or stop, the genocide. It's been over five months since Sec. Kerry declared the ISIS atrocities as genocide. "...it is important that Sec. Kerry act quickly and decisively in advancing at the U.N. the cause of those Christians targeted by ISIS," said ACLJ.

More than 1.3 million Christians have fled Iraq and another 1 million fled Syria according to the Knights of Columbus.

Archbishop Auza, observer of the Holy See to the U.N., said, "We know of summary executions and mass beheadings, sexual violence, immolations, beheading and crucifixions." Countless thousands have been subjected to rape, enslavement and death. (cnsnews.com, 8/31/16; dailysignal.com, 6/20/16; christianpost.com, 5/26/16)


