Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 9, 2015 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Kings 5:14-17 Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4 2 Timothy 2:8-13 Luke 17:11-19

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee. As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him. They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying,

"Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!"

And when he saw them, he said,

"Go show yourselves to the priests."

As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan.

Jesus said in reply,

"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?"

Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

- 1. How do you live a life of gratitude to God?
- 2. What are the leprosies in your life?
- 3. Describe a time when you felt like a stranger and someone welcomed you.

Family question:

Who are the people that you are most grateful for? How do you express gratitude to them?



Unjust California Bill Threatening Religious
Freedom Revised: Thanks to the prayers of many and the support of Los Angeles Catholic Archbishop
Gomez, Bishop Blake of the Church of God in Christ, nearly 150 Christian, Jewish and Muslim faith leaders, and many activist organizations, legislation that would have jeopardized the religious freedom of faith-based higher education, has been amended and no longer threatens access to state funding. The legislature was flooded with letters and messages saying the original bill violated religious freedom.

The so-called "Equality in Higher Education Act" would have forced religious schools that receive state funds, or whose students receive state aid, to adopt practices that conflict with their beliefs and teachings. It would mean faith-based institutions would no longer be able to determine for themselves the scope of their religious convictions as applied in student conduct policies, housing and restroom/locker facilities, and other matters of religious expression and campus life. Religious schools would be vulnerable to antidiscrimination lawsuits and unprecedented government policing.




