Parish History Project We Need Your Stuff!

As part of the Parish Jubilee, we are creating a video documentary of our parish history, which will be shown at a date in 2017 and also will be available for purchase.

We would like to include personal effects and memories that you, the people of the parish, have. We are doing collection of these items in stages. Right now we are focusing on the period of the **first 6 years of the parish** (1967-1973).

What we **already have** from this time period:

- Virtually all parish bulletins published (which began Feb. 1968).
- "Moreana" editions (which began Sept. 1971).
- The LP records created by the Folk Group ("Come Alive", "Our Factory of Love", "Godspell").
- Parish Council minutes.
- Long Island Catholic and secular press (Newsday, NY Times, etc.) articles/photos.

What we need from this time period:

- Photos/videos of sacraments received at STM (your baptisms, confirmations, weddings). Special need for ones taken at the old Factory.
- Photos/videos of our first pastor Fr. Kirwin and his assistants (Fr. John Cervini, Fr. Ed Caskin) or any of the transitional deacons while they were with us.
- Photos/videos of the construction of the original Parish Center and 3 major events (march and ground breaking on 7/25/1971, march and first Mass on 10/22/1972, dedication on 11/25/1973).
- Any prayer cards, buttons, fliers or other printed material that reference specific STM events or people.
- Personal memories: Were you on a committee back then (or, in the case of those that have passed away, was your late spouse)? Even if you weren't, do you have a special memory of parties, liturgies, our clergy from back then?? Did you march from the factory to the new Parish Center? Did you teach religion or run a RAP group? We would love to hear about it. We really would love to have you speak about it on camera (this is a video documentary, after all) but if you want to share "off-camera" that's ok too.

All documents/prints/slides will be handled with the utmost care, scanned and returned promptly. We can work with you if you have 8 mm video.
