

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 6, 2016 Thirty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time 2 Micah 7:1-2, 9-14 Psalm 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15 2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5 Luke 20:27-38

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying,

"Teacher, Moses wrote for us,

If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.

Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them,

"The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord,' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

Focus Questions:

1. Our God is not the God of the dead but of the living. How do you experience God in your life now?

2. What was your vision of heaven when you were young? How has that vision changed?

3. How has your first experience of death affected your life?

Family and children's question:

Spend some time this week praying for loved one who have died.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Employer: "Why are you late today?"

Employee: "I'm really not late, boss; I just took my coffee break before coming in."

We often try to justify our actions. We also want to find the reason why others act the way they do. Most often we don't hesitate to judge other's action as right or wrong.

Today's readings instruct us not to waste time in justification or judgement. They invite us to start living life without any hesitation. The first reading portrays that God knows our sins and offences, yet God could not hate or loathe anything because He created us and loves us. Rather than wasting time and energy on what we have not done right, God asks us to engage right away in the right way of living.

In the Gospel, Jesus invites himself to dine at Zacchaeus's home. In spite of knowing who he was and what he has done in the past, Jesus ventures to dine with him and to relate to him. Repentance for past sins is to begin right away-- the right living. Real repentance is not merely a feeling of guilt but a strong spiritual power to push the sinner to venture to a new life. Real repentance does not linger in reason/justification as to why the sinner did what he did, but instead makes a great push of grace to begin a life totally new.

This is what happens to Zacchaeus. When he realizes that Jesus is his guest, he does not feel small before God, but experiences a new strength to repair his past. His new future, as he declares, is just the reversal of his past; not the greedy grabbing of a tax-collector, but a free giving of a person touched by Jesus. Whoever meets Jesus begins to radically experience a new life right away. Let us start new. Let us pray to Jesus for the strength to do away with all our reasoning and justifications of continuing our past. Jesus invites and encourages us to begin a new life.

November 1st is All Saints day. All Saints Day is not merely a celebration of all the holy people who went before us. It is a call to each one of us to realize and live the power we have within us to become holy and to change "our lament into a whirling dance, to rip off our black mourning band and to deck ourselves with wildflowers... to burst forth into song" (Psalm 30:11-12). It is our feast. It is the feast of our real identity and inner power to change ourselves and the situation around us.

October 31st Halloween - November 1st All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the <u>Christian</u> holy day of <u>All Hallows' Day</u> (also known as *All Saints', Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. Thus giving the holiday on October 31st the full name of *All Hallows' Eve* which in popular use became *Halloween*.

God calls us to be saints and has given us the power to become saints. Thus when we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November first, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on October 31st, the eve of the feast of All Saints. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of evil and to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within ourselves.

Let us celebrate All Saints Day and Costume Mass on November 1st: In the background of what I explained above, I have invited all the children to attend the 9:15 am Mass in their Halloween and Saint costumes. Like the children, teens and adults are also invited with your Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Tuesday, November 1st at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

November 2^{nd} is All Souls Day. At 7:00 pm is the memorial mass for all those who passed away from us in the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families whose loved ones were buried at our church. Please feel free to join us to pray for the deceased members of our families.





CATHOLICS FOR FREEDOM OF RELIGION



If a candidate is right on lesser issues but votes wrongly on key moral issues, Pope St. John Paul II said, "The common outcry,

which is justly made on behalf of human rights is false and illusory if the right to life, the most

basic and fundamental right and the condition for all other personal rights, is not defended with maximum determination."

Religious Liberty in Doubt:

Pope Benedict XVI stated, "It is imperative that the entire Catholic (Christian) community in the U.S. come to realize the **grave threats to the Church's moral witness** ... of particular concern are attempts to limit that most cherished of American freedoms, the freedom of religion. ... concerted efforts have been made to deny the right of conscientious objection on the part of individuals and institutions with regard to cooperation in **intrinsically evil practices** (Jan. 19, 2012)

"In the United States, religious freedom generally enjoys strong protection in our law and culture, but those protections are now in doubt. For example, the longstanding tax exemption of the Church (and by implication, all religions) has been explicitly called into question at the highest levels of government, precisely because of her teachings ... (believers) have a particular duty to make sure that protections like these do not weaken but instead grow in strength. This is not only to secure the just freedom of the Church and the faithful here but also to offer **hope** and an **encouraging witness** to those who suffer direct and even violent religious persecution in countries where the protection is far weaker." (USCCB, Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship)

"As a nation, we share many blessings and strengths including a tradition of religious freedom and political participation ... we face serious challenges that are both political and moral." USCCB (U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops)

Almighty God, may we elect candidates who will always uphold the common good, avoid intrinsic evil and protect our God-given rights to life and to freedom of conscience. In concert with the great founders of our nation, may we confidently proclaim, "In God we Trust." Amen
