

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 13, 2016 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Malachi 3:19-20a Psalm 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 Luke 21:5-19

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings,

Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

Then they asked him,

"Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?"

He answered,

"See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end."

Then he said to them,

"Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents, brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Focus Questions:

1. What fear keeps you awake at night?

2. Describe a time in your life when you had to persevere in order to stand up for what you believed to be right.

3. With wars, famine and suffering in the news many become discouraged. Where do you find God in the midst of suffering.

Family and children's question:

As a family pray for a good outcome to the elections.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A six year old ran up and down the supermarket aisles shouting frantically, "Marian, Marian." Finally reunited with his mother, he was chided by her, "You should not call me 'Marian.' I am your mother you know."

"I know, he replied, "but the store is full of mothers."

Yes, the mother is right— she is more a mother to him than a person like any other with a specific name. Yes, the son is right. She is not one of many mothers but Marian his own mother. We need a name to specify us. But in our essence we are bigger than our specific traits or particularities, that which belong only to one's own specific self. Our particularities are the media through which we try to express our true essence. We need our particularities to maintain our individuality. But if we fail to live our essence we will be easily prisoned in our particularities.

All our human laws, rules and regulations are particularities, explaining how one should behave in a particular situation. Their aim is to help us live the heavenly essence on earth. We made them in order that we all can live our particularities/ differences in such way without hurting each other and promoting the life of living harmoniously our real essence as God's children,

In today's Gospel Jesus corrects the Sadducees for having misused the law in disrupting our heavenly essence. The human law is a help to live the heavenly essence on earth. It is not made to interpret heavenly realities in earthly terms. They are made by us to bring heaven on earth not the other way around, i.e. to impose the earth particularities/differences on heavenly realities. Let us try to live our heavenly realities in our earthly particularities.
