Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 18, 2016 Fourth Sunday of Advent Isaiah 7:10-14 Psalm 24:1-2, 3-4, 5-6 Romans 1:1-7 Matthew 1:18-24

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When John the Baptist heard in prison of the works of the Christ, he sent his disciples to Jesus with this question, "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another?"

Jesus said to them in reply,

"Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them. And blessed is the one who takes no offense at me."

As they were going off, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John,

"What did you go out to the desert to see? A reed swayed by the wind? Then what did you go out to see? Someone dressed in fine clothing? Those who wear fine clothing are in royal palaces. Then why did you go out? To see a prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a prophet. This is the one about whom it is written:

Behold, I am sending my messenger ahead of you; he will prepare your way before you.

Amen, I say to you, among those born of women there has been none greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you trusted in God in a very difficult situation.
- 2. Describe a time when you felt your trust had been betrayed by someone you loved. How was that trust re-established?
- 3. Relate a time when you changed a decision you made after prayer and reflection.

Family and children's question:

The angel tells Joseph that Jesus will be called Emmanuel, meaning "God is with us". Talk about how God is with us each moment of everyday. What signs do you see of God's presence in your life?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Wife to her husband during an argument: "I could make a fortune if I could buy you for what I think of you and sell you for what you think of yourself." Whenever we happen to judge the other we tend to consider others less valuable than ourselves.

The Readings of the third week of Advent paint a picture of how God thinks of us and what kind of future God envisions for us. Nothing of our humble and unholy status stops God's coming to us. Precisely our poor and unworthy status makes God come to us that our blindness may see, deafness may hear and lameness may leap.

In today's Gospel John the Baptist wants to make sure that he introduced the right person as Jesus. Jesus clears his doubt by indicating how the blind, deaf and lame are healed. Jesus confirms to John that his works of healing are the sign of God's working among his people. Advent leads us towards Christmas, the joyful celebration of God in Jesus coming to heal and live with us. It invites us to be healed of our blindness to see everything as God sees. It challenges us to hear more than what we like to hear so that we can leap beyond our own convenient circle and venture to live in God's circle. May Advent open our eyes, ears and hearts.

As you know the feasibility study was going on for the past two months. Please see the reports of the study found in this edition of the bulletin. Thank-you for your participation and valuable suggestions.

December of 1967 the Parish Community of St. Thomas More was born. This December we complete 49 years. By God's gracious providence we begin the 50th year, the GOLDEN JUBILEE this December. I invite you personally to the Kick-off event of the Golden Jubilee on December 10th, 2016. It starts at 5:00 pm with Mass, where the children will be able to meet the members of the family of St. Thomas More from the 16th century. After the Mass we will have the tree-lighting, followed by the arrival of Santa to take us to Walden Hall for food and a photo opportunity with Santa and the members of the Family of St. Thomas More. Please come let us declare open our Golden Jubilee year.

As the Church community enters into this Advent season we are called to a period of watchful longing and preparation in anticipation of the birth of Jesus on Christmas day. I liken Advent to an extended vigil period wherein we wait, we pray and we are aware -- aware of the subtle movements of grace in our hearts. A characteristic of a vigil is that of protection. We do this often--perhaps not even aware we are sitting vigil. Parents who wait through the night with a child who is ill; those who sit at the bedside of a loved one who is preparing for the greatest of transitions-- to eternal life after death; I suggest the many times we help our children prepare the night before for a test is a vigil. And what of the expectant parents? Is not their wait one of vigil? Praying and protecting the new life within? And so, vigils are intentional, purposeful and prayerful.

As we prepare to welcome the infant Jesus on Christmas day, it is important to consider the measures the Church has implemented, and continues to enforce, in order to keep safe those most vulnerable among us-- the children. We have learned from the tragic mistakes of the past--and now we are called to maintain a vigil--to insure the safety of children in our community. To this end, in 2005, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has written The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People. The Charter, approved by the full body of bishops outlines the policies and procedures all Dioceses are to implement in their efforts to protect children. Copies of the The Charter are available by contacting the Office for the Protection of Children and Young People (516-678-5800 x 507). In response to the directives set forth in The Charter, the Diocese of Rockville Centre has implemented programs, policies and procedures which every parish, throughout the Diocese, must adhere to. It is important to remember these regulations were established by the USCCB and it is our obligation as faithful members of the community to abide by these. Some of these directives may be familiar to you:

All employees and volunteers must attend the Virtus

program: *Protecting God's Children*• All employees and volunteers must sign Codes of Conduct-which outline expected behaviors of those in ministry. Volunteers complete a Volunteer Application/Employees

complete an Employment Application.

Consent to be background screened--with this the USCCB acknowledged that historical information is important to the protection of children.

Established a 24 hour confidential hotline number: 516-594-9063. Anyone suspecting abuse by someone affiliated with the Church is urged to call the hotline. Calls are confidential and responded to within 24 hours.

We were reminded that a vigil is characterized by waiting, by protecting and by prayer. Let us remember that the Vigil to keep all children safe is on-going and requires the diligence of all.

Religious Expression in Public Schools at Christmas continued:



There are a multitude of incidents in which ongoing confusion arising over the do's and don'ts of celebrating Christmas in schools, workplaces and elsewhere has led to perfectly constitutional activity being

suppressed. For example, a public school 6th grade class was asked to make "holiday cards" to send to the troops but were told they could not use the words "Merry Christmas" on their cards. (rutherford.org, 12/17/13)

A Georgia elementary school had a long tradition of displaying Christmas cards on the hallways. Mysteriously, the cards disappeared after Thanksgiving break when administrators ordered their relocation away from the students' view after a demand from an anti-religious law firm. Following an intervention by Liberty Institute, the school board issued a notice supporting religious liberty. (firstliberty.org, 12/2013)

"Public school students' written or spoken personal expressions concerning the religious significance of Christmas may not be censored by school officials absent evidence that the speech would cause a substantial disruption." (Twelve Rules of Christmas, rutherford.org)

"Public school teachers may send Christmas cards to the families of their students so long as they do so on their own time, outside of school hours."




