Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 25, 2016 The Nativity of the Lord (Christmas) Isaiah 52:7-10 Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4, 5-6 Hebrews 1:1-6 John 1:1-18

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

A man named John was sent from God. He came for testimony, to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to testify to the light. The true light, which enlightens everyone, was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world came to be through him, but the world did not know him. He came to what was his own, but his own people did not accept him.

But to those who did accept him he gave power to become children of God, to those who believe in his name, who were born not by natural generation nor by human choice nor by a man's decision but of God. And the Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth. John testified to him and cried out, saying,

"This was he of whom I said,

'The one who is coming after me ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.'" From his fullness we have all received, grace in place of grace, because while the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. No one has ever seen God. The only Son, God, who is at the Father's side, has revealed him.

Focus questions:

- 1. As a Christian how do you testify to the light?
- 2. Describe a time when another person's words revealed God's presence to you.
- 3. Describe a time when you witnessed light shining despite the darkness all around.

Family and children's question:

Mary gave birth to Jesus. How do you share the gift of Jesus with others?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Judge: Have you a lawyer?

Prisoner: No, I have good friends on the jury.

When it come to the question of being judged, the system will judge the person by the power of law but the people will judge the person by the virtue of relationships.

The readings of the fourth week of Advent proclaim that God comes, not as a judge to accuse or acquit us by the mandates of the law, but on the basis of relationships. He comes to us as one of us, to be with us, to relate with us and to share divine life with us. The Gospel gives two names for God's child-- Jesus and Emmanuel. Emmanuel means God is with us. Jesus means God saves us. These two names express the meaning of God's birth among us.

God is with us in order to save us from sin and suffering. God is Emmanuel not to simply approve all that we do and leave us to die in our wretched state. Emmanuel is Jesus who saves/uplifts us from our sin through faith and grace to become holy. In the second reading Paul explains that God's promise has now become fulfilled in the birth of Jesus, to be with us as a human child of the family of David, in order to save us from sin and to make us holy. Christmas is a week away. Let us examine ourselves and surrender ourselves to the one who has come to be with us as Emmanuel, and to save us as Jesus.

Time of our Golden Jubilee: On Saturday 12/10 the Family of St. Thomas More from the 16th Century visited us to declare open our Golden Jubilee year. A heartfelt thank-you to the members of the Genovese family who depicted the family- spirit of St. Thomas More. They introduced Santa Claus who brought the light of Bethlehem to light the Advent candle. That light of Bethlehem gave the right meaning to the Tree lighting event after the mass. Christ our light brightens to expel the darkness from our hearts, homes and our surroundings. Thanks to the elves of the youth ministry who set up the Christmas village in Walden Hall, with food, games, ornament makings etc. May this year of our Golden Jubilee bring lots of blessings to our parish family.

Golden Jubilee Banner inside and outside the church is a just reminder of God's mercy and love upon us for the past 49 years and for many more years to come, starting from this year of Golden jubilee. Congratulations to Carol Muzio who is the winner of the Golden Jubilee slogan contest. Her slogan, "United in the Love of Christ" chosen by the Steering Committee, is found in the Banner. May all that we celebrate during this year bear witness to being "united in the Love of Christ."


