Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 29, 2017
Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13
Psalm 146: 6-7, 8-9, 9-10
1 Corinthians 1:26-31
Matthew 5: 1-12A

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain, and after he had sat down, his disciples came to him.

He began to teach them, saying:

"Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are they who mourn,

for they will be comforted.

Blessed are the meek,

for they will inherit the land.

Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be satisfied.

Blessed are the merciful,

for they will be shown mercy.

Blessed are the clean of heart,

for they will see God.

Blessed are the peacemakers,

for they will be called children of God.

Blessed are they who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness,

for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Blessed are you when they insult you and persecute you

and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me.

Rejoice and be glad,

for your reward will be great in heaven."

Focus questions:

1. In the beatitudes Jesus tells his followers who God blesses - the poor in spirit, those who mourn, the meek, those who long for justice, the merciful, the clean of heart, the peacemakers, those who are persecuted. Describe a time when you stood with one of these.

2. What do you do to help bring about peace?

3. Relate a time when someone showed mercy to you.

Family and children's question:

Talk about your blessings, the good things God has given you.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Bobby had been to a birthday party, and, knowing his weakness, his mother looked him straight in the eye and said, "I hope you didn't ask for a second piece of cake."

"No," replied Bobby. "I only asked Mrs. Jones for the recipe so you could make some like it and she gave me two more pieces just of her own accord."

This Sunday's Gospel narrates the story of Peter, Andrew, James and John, finding the right recipe for their life. They were fishermen but they preferred to abandon their profession for the higher call from Jesus. Thus the fishermen became the fishers of men. Their profession of hard labor is changed to a vocation to do God's labor. The true recipe of our life consists in changing our professions/works into God's work. When our works are done to fulfill God's purpose, they would not be a burden anymore but God's blessing both to us and to others. **As God called the disciples**, now He calls us to turn from our self-centered life style to a God-centered life. If we can repent or make such a turn, we can become the act of God to build God's kingdom in us and around us. God invites us 'to repent for the kingdom of God is at hand.'

Meeting of three ministries: A Joint-meeting is scheduled for the Eucharistic Ministers, Lectors and Altar Servers on **Saturday, February 4th after the 9:00 am mass** and again on **Friday, February 17th at 7:00 pm**. The purpose of the meeting is to introduce a new program for scheduling ministers, in order to avoid conflicts between ministries.

At present there are 90 Eucharistic ministers, 42 lectors and 60 altar servers. Twenty seven of the 42 lectors also generously serve as Eucharistic Ministers. Two young people do double ministries as Lectors and Altar Servers. Thus conflicts would inevitably arise during scheduling. The coordinators have come up with a computer software to schedule ministers involved in multiple ministries with minimal conflict. It would also remind the ministers on Wednesday if they are scheduled for Sunday of a particular week. Ministers can also interact with one another when in need of a substitute.

I strongly recommend that the ministers attend either one of the above meetings whichever one is convenient to them to learn this program. This will help them to serve at their availability and also to find substitutes if and when needed.

A notice posted by a student is very different than if a school official did it. 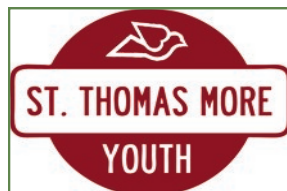
