Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 5, 2017 Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 58: 7-10 Psalm 112: 4-5. 6-7. 8-9 1 Corinthians 2: 1-5 Matthew 5: 13-16

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house.

Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father."

Focus questions:

1. Describe a time when you saw the light of Christ reflected in another person.

2. Relate a time when, by your actions, you helped bring light into a dark situation.

3. Relate a time when you hid your light.

Family and children's question:

Talk about what you do to brighten another person's day.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"I have a friend who is a real inventor. He took the fender from a Chevy, a motor from a Ford and the transmission from a BMW."

"Well, what did he get?"

"Three Years."

We would like to take the best from everything so that we can make the best of the best. In such a process we often lose the best we have within us.

Today's readings invite us to find the best that God has put in each of us. We look for the best outside of us because we focus on or are fed up with the worst in us. Paul indicates to the Corinthian believers that they are not wise, not powerful and not of noble birth according to human standards. But God chose to manifest God's power and wisdom through them . God wills to bring out in each of us the best with which He has created us. **Today's Gospel encourages in us the same truth.** Human standard may brand us that we are poor. But God's standard will make us realize that we are citizens of God's Kingdom. Being clean of heart, we may be unable to know the human cunningness but we will be able to see God. Being meek, we may be afraid that we will be treated as door-mats. No, Jesus promises that only the meek will inherit the land. The list of beatitudes encourages us to see the best even in our weakness. God has not created anybody or anything mean or useless. When we live the value and purpose that God has invested in us, we, each of us, become the best. Let us pray and find the best that is unique to us. Let us be aware and live the best for which God has created us.

Good news for "Good News Clubs":

A major victory for equal access has been won after a 3-year legal battle against the Cleveland Metropolitan School District (CMSD) that had imposed a facility fee on after-school Christian character-education clubs while providing free after-school access to non-religious groups such as the Boy Scouts. An Ohio federal district court found CMSD violated the constitutional rights of these Christian clubs and required the school district to change its facility use policies and pay \$150,000 in damages. 
