Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 12, 2017
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 58: 7-10
Psalm 112: 4-5. 6-7. 8-9
1 Corinthians 2: 1-5
Matthew 5: 20-22A, 27-28, 33-34A, 37

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I tell you, unless your righteousness surpasses that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will not enter the kingdom of heaven.

"You have heard that it was said to your ancestors, You shall not kill; and whoever kills will be liable to judgment.

But I say to you, whoever is angry with brother will be liable to judgment.

"You have heard that it was said,

You shall not commit adultery.

But I say to you, everyone who looks at a woman with lust has already committed adultery with her in his heart.

"Again you have heard that it was said to your ancestors, Do not take a false oath, but make good to the Lord all that

But I say to you, do not swear at all. Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,'and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the evil one."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you witnessed anger that led to something worse.
- 2. Relate a time when doing the minimum to get by was no longer good enough for you.
- 3. Relate a time when swearing was a problem for you.

Family and children's question:

In today's Gospel, Jesus challenges us to look within ourselves to see whether we are acting out of love or just doing what is expected of us. How can you become a more loving person?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The bus was crowded. The highway was very busy and the road was snow-covered. A woman passenger persisted in asking the driver if he had come to her stop yet.

Finally she asked, "How will I know when we get to my stop?"

The driver said, "By the big smile on my face, lady."

'From the fullness of the heart mouth speaks' (Mt. 12:34). The body is just an expression of what the heart is filled with. If the heart is full of light we begin to shine. If the heart is bitter, our words sound horrible and the looks flare fiercely.

Today's second reading describes that we are spiritually potent. We, like Paul, are the demonstration of God's Spirit and Power. Our life, as an expression of our belief in God, does not rest on human wisdom but on the power of God.

Today's Gospel empowers us to portray that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. With the power of God working in us, we can act like salt. Just as salt flavors food, so too can we bring the taste of God in whatever we do and with whomever we relate. God has filled us with divine light so that our activities and behavior can shine God's light.

If only we decide to live our true identity from God we would be like the city on the mountain top that cannot be hidden. But we can also choose to be sluggish and dull about our inner Godly power; then, as Jesus says, we would lose the taste of salt, our true essence, to be trampled underfoot or we would snuff out our inner Godly light by putting ourselves under a bushel. Let us shine God's light. May our words and deeds bring the taste of God.

We have a New Bishop the Most Rev. John Barres. On Tuesday, January 31 Bishop John Barres was installed as the Fifth Bishop of our Diocese. He begins his ministry of being a Shepherd with the motto "Holiness and Mission". He explained in his sermon that we are called to be holy through the word of God and sacraments that we may be sent as God's missionaries with God's power and message of love. We welcome him. We assure him of our prayers. We join hands with him in becoming God's missionaries to build God's kingdom in love and service.

For the month of February we have two celebrations to highlight our Golden Jubilee. 1) All the First graders with their families will have a family bingo night on Monday, February 13th. This is tuned towards the young families. 2) On Saturday, February 18th following the 5:00 pm Mass, the St. Vincent DePaul Conference of our Parish will host a Valentine Sock Hop. All are welcome. Tickets are sold in the Narthex. Come let us celebrate with our families. Come, be a part of our history.

Atheist group wins battle to pull cross from Veterans **Memorial Park:**

Belle Plaine, MN - A monument depicting the silhouette of a soldier kneeling at the grave of a fallen comrade with a headstone marked by a cross, has had the cross cut off. "It's a grave marker - in this instance, it's not a religious symbol," said a resident from a family of veterans. "It's frustrating to see that one or two people are allowed to speak for a town of over 3,00 people," said another resident, who started a movement to fight back by displaying crosses in front yards and nearby businesses.

Also, a nearby manufacturing plant will deliver 400 copies of the original metal statue - cross and all - to the veterans club for residents to purchase and display on their own property. (startribune.com, 1/25/17; alphanewsmn.com, 1/19/17)

"Hall of Shame" 2016 report:

For the first time, the United States has been named among the top 12 nations where Christians are targeted for their faith by International Christian Concern (ICC), a persecution watchdog group. "While conditions in the U.S. are in no way comparable to other countries on the list, a certain segment of the culture and the courts seem to be intent on driving faith out of the public square. There have been too many court cases with bad decisions to miss the clear trend line," said Jeff King, president of ICC.
