Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 19, 2017 Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time Leviticus 19: 1-2, 17-18 Psalm 103: 1-2, 3-4, 8, 10, 12-13 1 Corinthians 3: 16-23 Matthew 5: 38-48

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"You have heard that it was said,

An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.

But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well.

Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow.

"You have heard that it was said,

You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.

But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust.

For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when someone went the extra mile for you.
- 2. Relate a time when you turned the other cheek.
- 3. Relate an experience of forgiving someone who wronged you.

Family and children's question:

Talk about what Jesus is saying in the Gospel about loving and forgiving even the people who hurt you. Talk about the times when you were able to do that.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Mother: "How could you be so rude as to tell your sister she's stupid? Tell her you're sorry."

Boy: "Sis, I'm sorry you're stupid."

Yes, the boy obeyed his mom by expressing his 'sorry' but his act of obedience did not have the spirit of sorry for hurting his sister. The law is not merely an act of doing something but a means of living one's goodness and avoiding the occasions of hurting.

Today's readings liberate us from the burdens of law by living the spirit of the law. The purpose of the law is to save us from evil and death and thus enable us to savor the goodness and the fullness of life. The aim of the law is not merely to impose upon us the 'do's and 'don'ts. Rather the law focuses on our freedom to choose good over evil, life over death. Thus law is not an external agent but an internal ignition to choose goodness and life.

In today's Gospel Jesus treats the law as an initial inspiring agent to rightly activate our inner, positive, spiritual force. The law does not contain any power. It can only stipulate and thus offer a choice to do or not to do an act. Rather we empower the law with our positive or negative response to it. Jesus asks us to take the law to inspire the inner positive spiritual force to bring out the best from us.

Jesus gives various examples on how to handle the law. The aim of the law 'you shall not kill' is not to inform us what we should not do in order to avoid murder. Rather, the law invites us to realize how spiritually and positively potent we are to be the best to avoid the anger which is the cause of murder. Let us not limit ourselves with 'do's and 'don'ts but bloom with our inner spiritual power to be the best.

For the month of February we have two celebrations to highlight our Golden Jubilee. 1) All the First graders with their families will have a family bingo night on Monday, February 13th. This is tuned towards the young families. 2) On Saturday, February 18th following the 5:00 pm Mass, the St. Vincent DePaul of our Parish hosts Valentine Sock Hop. All are welcome. Tickets are sold in the Narthex. Come let us celebrate with our families. Come, be a part of our history.

These are Mexico, Russia, and sadly, the United States," said International Christian Concern president, Jeff King.

"Christians in the U.S. are facing constant attacks in the media and are being marginalized through the law. The media portrays Christians as bigoted, racist, and close-minded."






For Young Adults: Small Group (Ages 21 to 28)
