February 26, 2017 Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 49:14-15 Psalm 62:2-3, 6-7, 8-9 1 Corinthians 4:1-5 Matthew 6:24-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"No one can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.

"Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink, or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds in the sky; they do not sow or reap, they gather nothing into barns, yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are not you more important than they? Can any of you by worrying add a single moment to your life-span? Why are you anxious about clothes? Learn from the way the wild flowers grow. They do not work or spin. But I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendor was clothed like one of them. If God so clothes the grass of the field, which grows today and is thrown into the oven tomorrow, will he not much more provide for you, O you of little faith?

So do not worry and say, 'What are we to eat?' or 'What are we to drink?' or 'What are we to wear?' All these things the pagans seek. Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given you besides. Do not worry about tomorrow; tomorrow will take care of itself. Sufficient for a day is its own evil."

Focus questions:

- 1. Relate an experience when you had to rely on trust.
- 2. Relate a time when you spent a lot of time worrying..
- 3. Relate a time when the words of this Gospel helped you through a difficult time.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the times when you worried and what helped you with your troubles.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Terry: Did anyone around here lose a roll of bills with a rubber band?

Jim: Yes, I did.

Terry: Well, I have found the rubber band.

Today's readings remind us that life without God is like a rubber band without the roll of bills.

When the readings say 'Be holy, for, the Lord God, am holy' or 'Be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect' it seems to demand something impossible of us. Nobody can be perfect or holy as God is. We are sinners in our thoughts, words and deeds. How can we be pure and holy like God without any sin? It all depends on what we mean by being holy?

Holiness is not merely our effort to do something good or our exercise to refrain from something evil. Holiness is basically allowing God to work in us. To be holy is to realize our real essence that we bear the image of God who created us with positive energy, holiness and blessing. To be holy or to act holy is to free ourselves from our selfish way of acting, and thus to bring our inner spiritual power to do what God wants to achieve in us.

For example, it is but human to strike back the one who struck us on the cheek. But as Jesus reminds us in the Gospel, we can act from the inner God-given power not only to refrain from striking back but ready to show the other cheek. Likewise, it is but our selfish tendency to love those who love us and to hate those who hate us. But as children of God we have the power to do what God does. God shines the sun and showers the rain on both the good and the bad. Thus we can pray not only for our beloved ones but also for our enemies. We have Godly power in us even to love our enemies. Let us pray to realize the God-given inner power.

I am grateful to the Youth Group who made special Valentine's crafts for our parishioners who attend the daily 9 am Mass. This connection of love between the young and an older generation truly is a lovely gesture. We are a week away from March. We begin the season of lent with Ash Wednesday on March 1st. This is our 50th (Golden Jubilee) lent for the parish family of St. Thomas More. Let us pray that this year's lent brings special blessings from God. We also have a great social event (St. Patrick's Day) specially arranged in celebration of our Golden Jubilee. Further information will be available in forthcoming bulletins. Let us pray that we may be spiritually blessed and a beloved community socially.

Freedom of Faith vs. Doctor Assisted **Suicide Laws:**

Vermont: Alliance Defending Freedom attorneys have filed suit in federal court against Vermont Board of Medical Practice, etc. on behalf of doctors who fear that state agencies are construing Vermont's assisted suicide law as requiring them, regardless of their conscience or oath to "do no harm", to counsel patients on doctor-prescribed death as an option. According to state agencies, only doctors may refer patients to others for assisted suicide counseling. However, these health care professionals contend it is unethical for them to counsel for, refer for, or in any way participate in suicide.

"The government shouldn't be telling health care professionals that they must violate their medical ethics in order to practice medicine," said ADF Senior Counsel. "These doctors and health workers deeply believe that suffering patients need understanding and sound medical treatment, not encouragement to kill themselves. The state has no authority to order them to act contrary to that sincere and time-honored conviction." (adflegal.org, 7/21/16)

California: The insurance company for terminally ill Stephanie Parker, wife and mother of four, denied her a different chemotherapy drug after California's End of Life Option Act was passed in 2016. She was told that while chemotherapy was denied, suicide pills were covered under her plan. "As soon as this law was passed ... patients fighting for a longer life end up getting denied treatment, because this (suicide) will always be the cheapest option," she said.

Hippocratic Oath: ".. I will use treatment to help the sick according to my ability and judgment, but never with a view to injury and wrong-doing. Neither will I administer poison to anybody when asked to do so, nor will I suggest such a course."


