



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 5, 2017 First Sunday of Lent Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7 Psalm 51:3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 17 Romans 5: 12-19 Matthew 4:1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him.

"If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread."

He said in reply,

"It is written:

One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God."

Then the devil took him to the holy city, and made him stand on the parapet of the temple, and said to him,

"If you are the Son of God, throw yourself down.

For it is written:

He will command his angels concerning you and with their hands they will support you, lest you dash your foot against a stone." Jesus answered him,

"Again it is written,

You shall not put the Lord, your God, to the test."

Then the devil took him up to a very high mountain, and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in their magnificence, and he said to him,

"All these I shall give to you, if you will prostrate yourself and worship me."

At this, Jesus said to him, "Get away, Satan!

It is written:

The Lord, your God, shall you worship and him alone shall you serve."

Then the devil left him and, behold, angels came and ministered to him.

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you went on a long fast from something which helped you in your relationship with God.
- 2. Relate a time when you stayed true to what you believed in despite outside pressure.
- 3. Relate a time when you trusted without a guarantee that everything would turn out okay.

Family and children's question:

Describe a time when you felt all alone. Who came to reassure you?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Willy: I had a hunch today. I got up at seven, had seven dollars in my pocket, there were seven people at lunch and there were seven horses in the race. I picked the seventh to win.

Billy: So he came in the winner?

Willy: No, he came in seventh.

Life is not a number game to measure or calculate its outcome. It is not an idea nor a philosophy, neither a

system nor a mechanism to regulate its running or functioning. It is a gift and mystery. As a gift freely given by God, it can offer more than we can imagine. As a mystery, it contains more than what we know about it.

Today's readings invite us to grasp life to be under God's care. If life does not happen the way we expect, we have to assure ourselves that God cares for us like a mother or even more than a mother. God promises that even if a mother should forget her child, the Lord would never forget us. God kindly reminds us how much more He cares for us by showing how he feeds the freely flying bird and clothes the colorfully blooming flowers even though they do not anxiously toil for it as we do in our lives.

Worry exists only in the mind which cannot see life as a gift or as a mystery from God but measures life by human standards of wealth, beauty, fame etc. Worry or anxiety ceases to exist in a person who surrenders one's life to God's providence and begins to live every moment of life as a God-given gift and a mystery which has more to offer as life then what we expect from it. Let us pray to God, as Jesus teaches us, for the heart of a bird to loosen the human bonds and for the attitude of a flower to bloom and embrace beauty in and around us.

This Wednesday, March 1st is Ash Wednesday, the start of the Lenten season. Lent is a time of grace. We reflect on the mystery of God sharing in our suffering. In Jesus God shared with us even in death. God shared with our suffering not just to console us but to radically change the moment of suffering into occasions of inner strength. He shared in our death in order to transform it into eternal life.

Our parish offers various spiritual exercises to grow in this spiritual realization during the 40 days of Lent. Every day we have <u>Lenten morning prayers</u> before the 9:00 am mass. <u>Every Friday</u> we will pray <u>the Stations of the Cross at 7:00 pm</u> for grace upon those undergoing various sufferings.

Lenten Mission by Fr. Joseph Fitzgerlad from March 26 to 29 both in the morning mass at 9 am and in the evening at 7 pm. **Lenten Project for this year is to help St. Francis Hospital**, a private hospital run by the Little Sisters of

St. Francis in the Kasarani neighborhood of Nairobi, Kenya, for the women in Nairobi's largest slum who can't afford to go anywhere else, come and give birth. The hospital has a capacity for 300 births per month, but in

reality, more than 1,000 women give birth there each month. The following website will give more information about this project.

Assisted Suicide and Physicians' Conscience Rights:

Opponents of Physician-Assisted-Suicide (PAS) contend that doctors have a moral responsibility to keep patients alive as reflected in the Hippocratic Oath. They argue there may be a "slippery slope" from euthanasia to murder and that PAS will unfairly target the poor and disabled and create incentives for insurance companies to terminate lives in order to save money. This "slippery slope" argument is addressed by Dr. Ezekiel Emanuel, writing about ethics in the Atlantic Monthly, in which he affirms that there is a lesson to be learned from the Netherlands and Belgium, where there is widespread breach of legal safeguards leading to a sizable incidence of non-voluntary euthanasia. He fears the eventual outcome of PAS laws could be euthanasia of the demented, the mentally ill, the old, and others. (heritage.org, 3/24/15; cmda.org, 7/18/16)

A Warning from Canada:

The "Medical Assistance in Dying" report, February, 2016, recommended that all Canadian doctors have a legal **duty** either to provide assisted suicide or provide an "effective referral" to someone who will provide it. Recommendation 10 of the report recognizes there may be a direct conflict of rights and interests between a patient seeking suicide and a doctor with ethical and moral standards opposed to providing this option. However, Recommendation 10 subordinates the values, rights and ethical interests of the doctor to the wishes of the patient.

Many physicians in Canada warn of this "slippery slope" to the kind of social and medical ethics that corrupts and erodes the core virtues essential for survival of a free society. It would be wise to pay attention to what is happening in Canada, the Netherlands, Belgium, and Switzerland, since already six American states (CA, OR, WA, MT, NM, and VT) have recently legalized physician assisted suicide. The New York State legislature is now considering a so-called "medical aid in dying" bill. (cnsnews.com, 3/18/16; stat news.com, 1/19/17; latimes.com, 5/16/16)





Lent 2017

Dear Friends:

Lent 2017 is a time for us to pray for dramatic missionary growth in the Diocese of Rockville Centre.

Part of that dramatic missionary growth is stimulated by our willingness to invite our inactive Catholic friends back to Mass.

I put it this way in my Installation Mass homily on January 31: I appeal on this day of my Installation as the fifth Bishop of the Diocese of Rockville Centre to every inactive Catholic in the Diocese to come back to the power of the Word of God, the power of the Sacrament of Penance, and the power of the Catholic Mass.

I am so very sorry if you have been hurt or disappointed by the Church in any way and we stand here today to support you, to love you and to listen to you.

In turn, I am asking every active Catholic of every age in the Diocese of Rockville Centre between January 31st and Ash Wednesday (which is March 1, 2017) to invite one inactive Catholic friend or family to come with you to Mass and to gently, humbly, compassionately, non-judgmentally witness to the beauty of your intimacy with Christ and your love for the mission of the Catholic Church and how it has enriched and inspired your life.

The power of these gentle and compassionate invitations is enormous. They always plant a seed of grace. And now's the time to make these invitations. Let's all do it together and realize that it is the kindest thing any of us could do for anyone.

For those who have made those invitations since January 31st, thank you! For those of us who need an extension, let's give ourselves till Easter Sunday, April 16, 2017 to make that compassionate invitation to our friends. And let's open ourselves to making these invitations more frequently and consistently.

When we die, we will all look lovingly into the merciful eyes of Jesus and review our life with him. The people whom we have helped to invite back to Mass and their Catholic faith will be standing around us with radiant smiles. And we want a big crowd!

We connect our Lenten 2017 prayer, fasting and almsgiving together to this intention and to our constant intention to pray for our brothers and sisters who are poor, hungry, suffering from war, violence or persecution in our world.

You and your families are all daily in my prayers and Masses. Thank you for your witness of "holiness and mission" to the world.
