FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Judge: Guilty or not guilty?

Prisoner: Well, I thought I was guilty, but I've been talking to my lawyer and he's convinced me I'm not guilty.

Sin teaches us to escape the consequences of our actions but grace empowers us to engage in the blessings of our actions. **Readings of the First Week of Lent explain** that sin is nothing but our own wishful choice to shrink in our identity whereas grace is to bloom fully well in our identity of God's blessings. The first reading describes how the first parents lost the blessings of owning the whole Garden of Eden at the choice of their desire to eat the fruit from one tree. Their temptation consisted in exaggerating the particular benefit of a specific moment at the cost of losing the original blessing which endures for the whole life.

In the Gospel the devil tries the same technique with Jesus. The devil tempts Jesus to use his power for the particular need of food at the end of his 40-day fast. The temptation is to gratify his hunger instantly by using his power to change stones into bread – instant gratification. Jesus, unlike the first parents, replies to the tempter 'One does not live by bread alone but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God''.

By this Jesus means that his identity is bigger than instant gratification. His hunger is not the moment of reducing himself to do whatever he wants just to appease himself. But precisely hunger is the moment to show his dependence on the word of God. In short Jesus instructs the tempter that bodily hunger reminds him of his hunger for God's word. He is fed by the word of God as much as his body is fed by bread. Tempter/temptation reduces us to a particular need of a specific moment. Grace generously expands us and empowers us to live fully well our whole identity.

Lent is the time when we vigorously engage ourselves to live more from the spirit and less from our bodily need. When we fast we learn to say 'no' to bodily cravings. When we give alms to the poor we cultivate within ourselves the power of the spirit to go out of our selfish nature and to grow in the spirit of love, sharing and generosity. When we pray we being to see life and its value from the heart as God reveals to us, not as our convenient dry and habitual selfish thinking dictates to us.

The whole exercise of Lent is built upon these exercises of prayer, fast and almsgiving.

<u>Prayer</u>: please find a Lenten calendar in this bulletin which proposes a one- line prayer and an act for everyday so that you develop a habit of praying.

<u>Fast:</u> Every Friday try to abstain from taking meet. Choose a day in a week to fast from at least a meal or take a smaller meal than the regular one. Fast on Good Friday.

<u>Almsgiving</u>: Consider being a part of our parish Lenten project to help the Little Sisters of St. Francis, Nairobi, Kenya who run the St. Francis Hospital which has the capacity for 300 births per month, but in reality, more than 1000 women give birth there each month.

I wish you all a Blessed Lent to grow in spirit.

Victories for Religious Freedom:

Georgia: The state agreed to pay \$225,000 to settle a lawsuit claiming it illegally discriminated against a lay pastor who was fired by the states' Department of Public Health (DPH) because of the content of his sermons.

In 2014, Dr. Eric Walsh, MD, accepted the job as district health director with the DPH but was soon dismissed after a DPH official asked him to submit copies of sermons he had previously preached as a lay minister with the Seventh-day Adventist Church.

"No one should be fired for simply expressing his religious beliefs," said First Liberty senior counsel.

"I am grateful this trial has finally ended," said Dr. Walsh. "It's been a long difficult journey, but it's worth it to have my name cleared and to ensure that all Georgia government employees know they have religious liberty." (wnd.com, 2/9/17; christianindex.org, 2/10/17)

Minnesota: Veterans Memorial Park, Belle Plaine: The city has agreed to bring back a memorial showing the silhouette of a soldier with rifle kneeling in front of a cross.

A Freedom From Religion group had demanded the city remove the cross last month. Many supporters of vets responded by setting up their own crosses.

Amid the controversy, Alliance Defending Freedom proposed setting up a "limited public forum" inside the park where the original cross could stand. The newly approved plan "ensures that there is no endorsement of religion by the city because memorials that will be put up represent the citizens that put them up," said ADF.




