Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 7, 2017 Fourth Sunday of Easter Acts 2:14a, 36-41 Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b4, 5, 6 1 Peter 2:20b-25 John 10:1-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said:

"Amen, amen, I say to you, whoever does not enter a sheepfold through the gate but climbs over elsewhere is a thief and a robber. But whoever enters through the gate is the shepherd of the sheep. The gatekeeper opens it for him, and the sheep hear his voice, as the shepherd calls his own sheep by name and leads them out. When he has driven out all his own, he walks ahead of them, and the sheep follow him, because they recognize his voice. But they will not follow a stranger; they will run away from him, because they do not recognize the voice of strangers." Although Jesus used this figure of speech, the Pharisees did not realize what he was trying to tell them.

So Jesus said again, "Amen, amen, I say to you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the gate. Whoever enters through me will be saved, and will come in and go out and find pasture. A thief comes only to steal and slaughter and destroy; I came so that they might have life and have it more abundantly."

Focus questions:

- 1. Relate a time when, your faith sustained you during a difficult time in your life.
- 2. Describe a time when you heard the Good Shepherd's voice..
- 3. Whose voice do you follow for guidance in your life?

Family and children's question:

Jesus leads us to God. How are you listening to Jesus leading you to His Father?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Dad, what best protects a man from running wild... advice, restrictive law or stern counsel? Poverty, my son, poverty.

Poverty is the best teacher to wake a person up to his or her own potential. Our dependence on external richness will obstruct growth of the inner spiritual richness. Poverty is a freedom. It allows us not to depend on anything external to ourselves. It empties us from our external dependence and opens us to be dependent on God alone. In today's Gospel Jesus open the eyes of the disciples to realize his risen presence within them. The two disciples based their belief on the stories from others about Jesus. But Jesus walked with them to narrate and explain His Resurrection story personally to them. While they ate Jesus made them realize His presence in the breaking of the bread with them. When they opened their hearts God could work with their inner richness to realize the Risen presence. God needs our emptiness and poverty, not our richness.

Jesus is there with us, in our daily walk of life, in our scripture reading and in the celebration of the sacraments. But if we are conveniently locked into our self-sufficiency and are filled with our own 'richness', it would be impossible to experience His presence. Today's readings invite us to open the eyes of our heart in belief. The message of Easter is that if we are only ready to believe God's mighty works in our midst, we will realize our capacity to be born anew and experience the power of new life.

Living memoir: In celebration of the Golden Jubilee we want to release a journal of our parish family. It would serve us as a time capsule featuring pictures and stories bringing the past to the present and rendering the present as a living document for the future. I invite you to be a part of this living memoir. Please look for details in the coming weeks.

Lenten Project: Thank you all for your generous contribution amounting to \$3,000. This will greatly help the Little Sisters of St. Francis in Nairobi, Kenya who run the St. Francis Hospital which has the capacity for 300 births per month, but where in reality, more than 1000 women give birth there each month. We will send them this gift in the name our Parish in the spirit of serving Jesus to the sick and the poor.

We thank Msgr. John Cervini for having celebrated a mass here and reminiscing with us about former times. We wish to invite Fr. John to please come to us whenever he passes this way. We assure him of our prayers for his priestly ministry.

U.S. Supreme Court's Most Important Religious Freedom Case This Term:

Question: Can states exhibit hostility to religion by prohibiting religiously affiliated schools from participating in otherwise neutral government programs solely because the groups have a religious identity?

Trinity Lutheran Church Learning Center in Missouri sought to participate in a Grant Program that provided rubberized material for school playgrounds made out of old tires in order to resurface their preschool playground with this safer, recycled material. Trinity was disqualified from the program based on an 1875 Missouri constitution amendment that prohibits public money being used to aid "any church, sect, or denomination or religion."

"The state admits that it blatantly excludes religious organizations from a safety program that has nothing to do with religion. That's precisely the kind of hostility to religion that the U.S. Constitution prohibits," said Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) Senior Counsel.

Being neutral "doesn't mean treating religious organizations worse than anyone else," ADF continued. If the government can block this benefit, what's next? "If a child is hurt on Trinity's playground, can the county hospital send an ambulance? Or, if the city provides fire extinguishers to all preschools, can it give some to Trinity?" 


