Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 21, 2017 Sixth Sunday of Easter Acts 8:5-8, 14-17 Psalm 66:1-3, 4-5, 6-7, 16, 20 1 Peter 3:15-18 John 14:15-21

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another Advocate to be with you always, the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot accept, because it neither sees nor knows him. But you know him, because he remains with you, and will be in you. I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you. In a little while the world will no longer see me, but you will see me, because I live and you will live. On that day you will realize that I am in my Father and you are in me and I in you. Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him."

Focus questions:

- 1. Relate a time when you became aware of the power of the Holy Spirit.
- 2. "The one who obeys my commandments is the one who loves me." Relate a time when you obeyed because you were loved.
- 3. Describe a time when you were left out or abandoned.

Family and children's question:

How do you show your love to others as Jesus commanded us to love one another.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Rob: What is four yards long, has six legs, and would kill you if it fell of a tree?

Ted: I don't know. Rob: A billiard table.

A riddle is a mental exercise to find a right answer from some known facts. Facts may not always lead to the right answer; that is why it is called a riddle. If we have to live life only from known facts, life would simply be a riddle leading to incorrect or less correct and confused answers.

Today's Gospel liberates us from the riddles of life and invites us to begin living life from relationship. Jesus explains that life is to be lived on the realization that Jesus lives in us and we in Him. Life is more a living experience in both gain or loss, in suffering or joy. It is not built upon dry reason or hard facts. Reason or facts can show only those sides of life that our senses or mind can grasp. But life, as a relationship with God and others, will open all the faculties of our being; our senses will begin to experience life, our mind will try to understand it and the soul will become one with it. Jesus says life is nothing but moments of experiencing and living our love for God and God's love for us and our love for each other. Let us pray that God inspires us in our soul, illuminates our mind and ignites our senses for the true experience of life in its wholeness.

Miracle of the Sun: Bishop John Barres, our Bishop has written a Pastoral letter to all of us in the diocese on the 100th Anniversary of the apparitions of Our Lady of Fatima asking her intercession for dramatic missionary growth on Long Island. We have begun our Capital Campaign. Our goal is to raise one million dollars to renovate the Sanctuary and to pave the parking lot. Groups are responding to the letters of invitation. They attend the meeting in the rectory and have started to pledge. So far 45 families have made pledges which have brought over \$300, 000 to our Campaign. St. Thomas More is known for its generosity and family spirit. Let us participate enthusiastically in the campaign.

We are the fruits of our past generations. Similarly our future generations will be our fruit. We thank God for having guided us in the past. Let us surrender our present to his guidance. Let us pray to the Lord to guide and support our endeavors now. In gratefully surrendering the present to God, we form a powerful future in God's providence. Let us always prayerfully remember the words of Psalm 127, "Unless the Lord build the house, in vain is the builder's labor. Unless the Lord guard the city, in vain does the guard keep the watch."



Free Speech Fairness Act of 2017:

The Free Speech Fairness Act was introduced to allow churches and nonprofits to participate in political speech. It would roll back the Johnson Amendment of 1954, named after Sen. Lyndon Johnson, that prevents any church or other nonprofit organization from endorsing or opposing political candidates - even for biblical reasons - and allowed the IRS to punish pastors, churches and nonprofit ministries with crippling audits and threats to take away tax exemptions. The Johnson Amendment has caused great confusion and concern about what tax exempt organizations can say about moral issues and political candidates.

The Fairness Act would restore free speech to churches, charities and their leaders who have effectively been silenced. The act proposes to "allow charitable organizations to make statements relating to political campaigns if such statements are made in the ordinary course of carrying out its tax exempt purpose."

"Thomas Jefferson's 'separation' coinage doesn't mean that there is a complete wall of separation between the two (church and state); it just means that the state should not have control over the church, nor shall the church maintain control over the state," wrote the Fairness Act's sponsors.



St. Thomas More - 50th Anniversary Capital Campaign

Grateful for our Past – Planning for our Future" Questions and Answers

Q: Why do we need to do work to the Church building?

A: Over the years normal wear and tear have taken its toll on the interior. The flooring is deteriorating, pews and kneelers are wearing down and is in need of a fresh coat of paint. Our Sanctuary is on multiple levels which limits the amount of usable space and is a real concern because of the risk of trips and falls and the potential for serious injury. We have already had a number of trips, falls and many close calls. In addition, our beautiful Tabernacle (the presence of the Lord) and Stained Glass Windows are out of sight from our liturgy.

Q: Why do we need to conduct a fundraising campaign?

A: The money received in the weekly offertory is used for the normal operating expenses of the parish, including salaries, utilities and funding of different groups and ministries. The capital campaign will provide the necessary funds that are needed to complete the necessary work without depleting our reserves or putting the parish in debt.

Q: What is the Priority order of the individual projects?

A: The first priority is to update the interior of the Church, then to repave the parking lot, add drainage and lighting and fix the curbs and walkways.

Q: When will the work begin?

A: The timeline is to complete Phase I as described in the brochure in the Fall of 2017 and Phase II in the Summer/Fall of 2019.

Q: Why am I being asked to pledge rather than pay cash?

A: We cannot expect to reach our goal with one-time donations. Pledging allows you to give what you truly believe to be a thoughtful, generous and proportionate gift. Pledging permits making larger gifts by spreading out the payments over a three to four year period. However, we appreciate one-time gifts and a 10% (or more) down payment on your pledge to help us with paying for these projects sooner and avoiding fees and interest costs.

Q: Is a down payment necessary to begin my pledge?

A: No. You can simply complete the pledge envelope without a down payment and incorporate the entire amount of the pledge into future payments.

Q: Can I pay more than a 10% down payment?

A: Yes. You can pay more than 10%.

Q: I am leaving the Church in my will, isn't that enough?

A: While we are happy that you have generously planned to remember the parish in your will, please keep in mind that this campaign addresses our most pressing needs.

Q: Can I pay with my Credit Card or Debit Card?

A: Yes. You will be able to use Faith Direct to pay your pledge. Indicate your interest in paying by credit card by checking the box on the pledge envelope.

Q: Is my pledge tax deductible? Are gifts other than cash acceptable?

A: All payments on a pledge are tax deductible to the full extent provided by law in each year of your pledge payment period. Funding your pledge with matured securities may provide additional tax benefits to you.

Q: Can we use local contractors for any of the work?

A: Yes and we hope to. Each project will be put out to bid and our hope is to obtain the best price, quality of work and they are a local company.

Q: Can we direct that our donation be used for a specific project?

A: Yes. If you wish you may designate your gift be used to fund one of the specific projects or phases we have outlined. Simply mark your intention on the pledge form and this will be honored.

Q: Will there be Memorials and how will gifts be recognized?

A: The Brochure will detail individual items and gift plan memorials that will be recognized on a new Memorial plaque that will be prominently displayed in the vestibule of the Church.
