Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 4, 2017
Pentecost Sunday
Acts 2:1-11
Psalm 104:1, 24, 29-30, 31, 34
1 Corinthians 12:3B-7, 12-13
John 20:19-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again,

"Peace be with you.

As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe when you were locked in fear.
- 2. To whom or to what situation might Christ be sending you to bring his peace?
- 3. Relate a time when you found forgiveness difficult. What helped you to forgive?

Family and children's question:

How do you bring peace to others?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Most of the time the actual life we live seems to be much different from what we dreamed of living or planned to live

Today's Gospel is Jesus' final prayer for his disciples before he would depart from them. Jesus expresses that he lived his earthly life fully well by accomplishing God's work. His scale of measuring his fulfilment in life is to do the will of God. He instructs his disciples to do the same. Jesus hands over all of them to God saying that they are God's.

How do we live our lives? We start with a dream, then plan to execute the dream and spend energy and time for the best of whatever happens. In this process of dreaming, planning and execution, if we rely only on ourselves we would burn out soon. That is why Jesus prays for us that our life may become God's dream, unfold God's plan and blossom as God's deed, in order to experience God's fulfillment as our life. Let us pray for God's dream, plan and fulfillment in our life.

Novena to the Holy Spirit: Next Sunday is the solemn feast of Pentecost, the feast of Jesus sending the Holy Spirit upon his believers. The Church prays for the Spirit to come upon all her members and missions for nine days from Ascension until Pentecost. I invite everyone of our parish to join this Novena from today until Saturday, June 2nd. Let us especially pray for our children that they receive the gifts of the Spirit to be conscious of God's grace in them, to choose and live God's Holy life; also that they may heave spiritual strength to say 'no' to evil and to avoid evil company.

Red Balloons: Volunteers of families of the children's mass will tie red balloons to your cars on Pentecost Sunday. Please bring the balloons to your home and tie them to your mail box. This is just an outward expression of the spiritual truth that you and your household are filled with gifts of Holy Spirit. The waving balloons proclaim your inner Spirit to show and share the fruits of the Holy Spirit like love, service, kindness, etc.

Court Upholds Conscience Rights of Business Owner

Five years after Hands On Originals t-shirt company was sued for declining to print t-shirts for the Lexington homosexual "Pride Festival," the Kentucky Court of Appeals ruled that no one should be forced to engage in speech they disagree with - including small business owners. "Christians should not be forced to violate their consciences in order to make a living," said Concerned Women for America legal counsel.

Initially, the city's Human Rights Commission found Blaine "guilty" of breaking the town's "fairness" ordinance and sentenced him to "diversity training." At the time, the Commission's Executive Director said it's time for Christians in the marketplace "to leave their religion at home." However, Blaine believed, "I don't leave my faith at the door when I walk into my business."

"Americans should always have the freedom to believe, the freedom to express those beliefs, and the freedom not to express ideas that would violate their conscience," said Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) Senior Counsel. "Protecting Blaine's freedom affirms everyone's freedom, no matter the nature of their beliefs or convictions. The government shouldn't be able to force citizens to create speech that conflicts with their deepest convictions, and the court's decision rightly affirms that." 


