



August 6, 2017
The Transfiguration of the Lord
Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14
Psalm 97:1-2, 5-6, 9
2 Peter 1:16-19
Matthew 17:1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus took Peter, James, and his brother, John, and led them up a high mountain by themselves. And he was transfigured before them; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became white as light. And behold, Moses and Elijah appeared to them, conversing with him.

Then Peter said to Jesus in reply,

"Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah."

While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud cast a shadow over them, then from the cloud came a voice that said.

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him."

When the disciples heard this, they fell prostrateand were very much afraid.

But Jesus came and touched them, saying,

"Rise, and do not be afraid."

And when the disciples raised their eyes, they saw no one else but Jesus alone.

As they were coming down from the mountain, Jesus charged them,

"Do not tell the vision to anyone until the Son of Man has been raised from the dead."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

If we procrastinate in our choosing, we will inevitably have to live with the choice made by others. Life is not a static principle. It is a beautiful flow of a chain of events, each of which happens at our free choice. We are our choices. If we fail to choose, someone will choose for us. Our choices make our life either joyfully livable or regrettably burdensome.

In Today's Gospel Jesus wants us to choose the best for our life and admonishes us to never settle for less. Life is a treasure that is hidden. Every moment of our living is an ongoing act of searching for the best. Every breath of ours engages us to go from good to better.in life We invest all that we have and are at the present moment to delve and dive into the best for the next moment. Jesus advises us not to get stuck in one place or to settle for anything so as not to be able to move on. Let us not get stuck and sunk or stay and stink.

Life is not an act of settling but investing to find the best. When we settle for anything, we begin to freeze in something less than the God-given lively growing self. When we settle for something we stop growing. Thus settling for something is to live less than for what we have been created.

Life is like the net which brings to shore both the good and bad. The fisherman picks the good discarding the bad and moves on to throw the net for the next catch. Likewise life becomes alive in every moment of choosing the good alone and moving on to throw the net for the next catch, which again would bring both the good and the bad. We always choose the good and move forward. Let us be the merchant of today's Gospel who invests everything of the present to strive and choose the best. Let us be the fisherman who throws the net which brings fish of every kind but chooses the good alone and moves on for the next catch.

Prose and Prayer: Mary Ellen Carroll is giving a course on Prose and Prayer explaining how God wrote our story with us in the past and what God wants to write with us in the future and how God writes our present with us and our fellow humans. It is a spiritual exercise of writing God's journal of our life. It will take place on the four Mondays of August from 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm in Walden Hall. Please call either the Rectory or the Religious Education Office if you plan to attend. **Golden Jubilee – May God renew and rebuild us:** Since last December we have celebrated at least two events every month in grateful commemoration of what God has done in us and for us during the past 50 years. The events were both social and spiritual, celebrating God's love for us and our love for God and for each other.

Last week there was a pre-bid walk for the contractors who wished to bid for the sanctuary renovation. This week the bidders will get back to us with their quote. It will take some time to go through the administrative channels in the diocese and parish to get the right person to do the work. As Psalm 127 says, "Unless the Lord build the house, they labor in vain who build. Unless the Lord guard the city, in vain does the guard keep watch." Let us pray that the renovation work may renew our faith in God.

We hope to begin the renovation work on October 1st and complete it by Christmas. During the time of renovation the church will remain closed. We will have our daily and weekend masses and all the other sacramental celebrations in Walden and Kirwin Halls.

Please bear with the inconvenience. Our patience and co-operation to accommodate the inconveniences with a smile will be a God-given moment of grace to build and grow as a community of love and service. Thank you for your understanding.

RELIGION School Districts Ban Prayer at HS Graduations

Indiana: Contrary to U.S. Department of Education Guidelines and a recently passed Indiana House Bill, the Elkhart Community Schools have surrendered to the "Freedom From Religion Foundation" and banned prayer from HS Graduations after one parent complained to FFRF that a recent graduation ceremony opened with a prayer.

However, in April, Indiana passed a House Bill complying with the Dept. of Education and the First Amendment that "Provides that public school students may pray or engage in religious activities or religious expression before, during, and after the school day in the same manner and to the same extent that students may engage in nonreligious activities or expression."

Pennsylvania: A student who was asked to deliver the closing exercise at Beaver HS graduation was not permitted to deliver her prepared remarks because she mentioned thanks to her "Heavenly Father" and "Lord."

The school district is in violation of the First Amendment and U.S. Dept. of Education policy that covers graduation ceremonies: "Where students or other graduation speakers are selected on the basis of genuinely neutral, evenhanded criteria and retain primary control over the content of their expression ... that expression may not be restricted because of its religious (or anti-religious) content."
