



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 24, 2017 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 55:6-9 Psalm 145:1-2- 3, 8- 9, 17-18 Philippians 1:20C-24, 27a Matthew 20:1-16a

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off.

And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.'

When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.'

When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."

#### **Focus questions:**

- 1. Describe a time when you experienced being treated unjustly.
- 2. Relate a time when the generosity of God felt overwhelming.
- 3. Relate a time when you were merciful and others in your group reacted negatively.?

#### Family and children's question:

This week make an extra effort to treat people you meet with kindness.

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

**Father returned home after a tough day** at the office and found his two daughters, of about kindergarten age, acting up quite boisterously. He gave them a moderately severe scolding and sent them off to bed. The next morning he found a note stuck on his bedroom door: "Be good to your children and they will be good to you - God."

The way we treat others is the way God will treat us.

**Today's Gospel reading is the story of forgiveness.** God is ready to forgive. But we should cultivate a heart within ourselves to deserve and enjoy the forgiveness. If we hold a grudge towards others we will not have a place in our heart to receive God's forgiveness. If our heart is generous to forgive others it will be ever tuned to dwell in God's forgiveness. **Mother Teresa used to say' If we criticize and harbor anger towards others** we will not have time to love them." It is not that God's forgiveness depends on our act of forgiving others. It is not that God's forgiveness is the reward for the forgiveness that we rendered to others. Rather God's forgiveness will not be well received in the heart that holds anger. The heart that is vengeful will not be able tune itself to the wavelength of God's forgiveness. God is generous in forgiveness and the heart must be free and empty to cherish it. Let us tune our hearts to forgive others in order to receive God's abundant mercy of forgiveness for us.

**Beach Mass:** We thank God for the wonderful weather for the beach mass. About 250 people of various ages attended the mass and had a friendly family time at the picnic after the mass. A heartfelt thanks to Pam Tarry and Rochelle Rouse who organized the event. The parish greatly appreciates the Knights of Columbus and the Columbiettes and all the volunteers who brought everything we needed for the mass and the food thereafter. The children's choir and Lou Savarese, our DJ did a great job. A big thank-you to all who helped us.

We are waiting for permission from the diocese to begin the renovation work in October. Having been guided by the Diocesan Department of Construction and Renovation, our building committee submitted all that is needed to the diocese.

Renovation is not merely what we do or for what we strive. It is primarily what God builds us to be. Renovating the sanctuary is only an occasion and opportunity to renew each of us and to grow together as a community of God. So let us live through this time in prayer and patience. There will be inconveniences during the next three months when we will close the main church. Please pray that all will go well and that we will soon get permission from the diocese and the cooperation of all the various workers to begin and finish the renovation work on time.

Thank you for your generosity -- our Capital Finance Campaign has reached almost 80% of the million dollar goal. I request those who are still praying about making a contribution, please make your donation to enable us to reach our goal.





#### **International Religious Freedom:**

Gov. Sam Brownback, KS, has been nominated as ambassador-at-large under the International Religious Freedom Act of 1998, designed as a "champion of conscience rights, helping government officials in the U.S. and abroad recognize the link between religious freedom and peace." "The position is necessary to maintain American leadership in assisting millions of individuals and minorities suffering religious persecution around the world."

"Three-quarters of the world's population live in countries with significant restrictions on religious freedom," said Rabbi David Saperstein, recent ambassador-at-large. As rates of religious persecution rose around the world, he pushed to get prisoners of conscience released, blasphemy laws repealed and the Islamic State's actions in Iraq and Syria classified as genocide. "There's a lot of work to be done, and country by country we do make improvements."

"Religious Freedom is the first freedom; the choice of what you do with your own soul. I am honored to serve such an important cause," said Gov. Brownback. (nytimes.com, 7/26/17; deseretnews.com, 7/30/17; nationalreview.com, 7/27/17)


