



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 1, 2017 Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Ezekiel 18:25-28 Psalm 25: 4-5, 6-7, 8-9 Philippians 2: 1-11 Matthew 21:28-32

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: "What is your opinion? A man had two sons. He came to the first and said,

'Son, go out and work in the vineyard today.'

He said in reply, 'I will not, ' but afterwards changed his mind and went. The man came to the other son and gave the same order. He said in reply, 'Yes, sir,' but did not go.

Which of the two did his father's will?"

They answered, "The first."

Jesus said to them, "Amen, I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you. When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him; but tax collectors and prostitutes did. Yet even when you saw that, you did not later change your minds and believe him."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when you meant to do something good for another but let the opportunity slip by.
- 2. Relate an experience when you were given a second chance.
- 3. Who do you identify with more, the older or the younger son?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you were asked to help but found an excuse not to.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

One of life's greatest mysteries is how the boy who wasn't good enough to marry your daughter can be the father of the smartest grandchild in the world. Yiddish Proverb.

Today's Gospel speaks about one such mystery of life. People are hired to work at different times of the day. Some work the whole day, some three quarters of the day, some half a day and a few work for just an hour... yet at the end all are equally paid the day's wage. How to interpret the action of the employer who represents God? Is God, the employer unfair to the workers or generous to them?

According to human logic God seems to be unfair, not paying according to each one's work but equaling the full time workers with part-time workers. But in God's point of view God pays more than what one deserves. The story explains the mystery of life.

Today's story of Jesus describes life from God's point of view. Life is not the reward or pay back for what we put in. Life is God's generous gift. For those who want to experience life as God's generous gift, there is always to appreciatively enjoy life more than what they toil for. But for those who approach life calculatingly, it has nothing more to offer than the wage for their toil. We don't have the power to make life "fair"

But we do have the power to make life joyful. Let us look at life and utter the beautiful line even in its unfair situation, "But, I love life." Let us avoid comparing ourselves with others and forget the blessings of life saying, "I love life, but...."

October begins a new era our Golden Jubilee: We will close the main church for the planned renovation. We got permission from the diocese to go ahead. All the necessary steps are taken to begin the work on time. During the construction we will use Kirwin Hall for the weekday celebration of mass. We will open the Walden Hall for the Sunday celebrations. All usual celebrations, like Baptisms, Holy Hours, Rosaries, Divine Mercy Chaplets, Funerals etc. will take place without fail. Needless to say, there will be some inconvenience during this time. But as a loving community, united by the love of Christ, we will undergo this time as an opportunity of building and renewing ourselves to enter the new renewed Church.

Our Finance Campaign is at its last phase. We are short of just \$190, 000 to reach the one million dollar goal. Just as in a running race, the runner summons up all his strength at the last leg to finish the race, so also at this point, whatever amount small or large you give will put us over the goal faster. People have given from \$100 to \$40,000. Our campaign has been conducted on the basis of equal sacrifice, not equal giving. So I kindly request those who are still considering giving, to please make a donation.

Heartfelt thanks to the Columbiettes who had a food drive recently and collected over 7200 pounds of food for the parish pantry. Thank you, ladies. You tap the generous hearts of people to feed the hungry mouths of the poor.



Senators Attack Judicial Nominee's Catholic Faith:

Despite the Constitution forbidding a religious litmus test, Sen. Dianne Feinstein and Sen. Dick Durbin attacked University of Notre Dame law professor Amy Barret, nominee for the 7th Circuit Court of Appeals, and a Catholic, accusing, "The dogma lives loudly within you," and "Do you consider yourself an orthodox Catholic?" These attacks followed Prof. Barret already stating, "It is never appropriate for a judge to apply their personal convictions whether it derive from faith or personal conviction."

"The Amy Barret hearing reveals a new disturbing trend: Anti-Christian sentiments which were only once whispered behind closed doors are now being proclaimed from the rooftops by the most powerful people in society," said research fellow, Ryan Anderson.

"At a time in which the nation is badly frayed, disoriented and confused, U.S. senators abused their high office to berate, slander, and demean a woman of exceptional legal wisdom simply because they suspected that aspects of her Catholic faith would make her an unjust judge," said a Catholic University of America professor. Fr. James Martin, S.J., said that Feinstein's comments were a "Throwback to an era when Catholics were seen as unthinking tools of the Pope. You can be a good Catholic citizen in our country. Ask JFK."


CEREAL BOX TOP COUPONS—Drop them off in the Church lobby drop-off box and we will use them to buy things for the students in our regional school.


