



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 8, 2017 **Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time** Isaiah 5:1-7 Psalm 80:9, 12, 13-14, 15-16 Philippians 4: 6-9 Matthew 21:33-43

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew: Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Hear another parable.

There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a hedge around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a tower. Then he leased it to tenants and went on a journey. When vintage time drew near, he sent his servants to the tenants to obtain his produce. But the tenants seized the servants and one they beat, another they killed, and a third they stoned. Again he sent other servants, more numerous than the first ones, but they treated them in the same way. Finally, he sent his son to them, thinking, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to one another, 'This is the heir. Come, let us kill him and acquire his inheritance.' They seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. What will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?"

They answered him,

"He will put those wretched men to a wretched death and lease his vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the proper times."

Jesus said to them, "Did you never read in the Scriptures: The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes?

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit."

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe a time when people outside the church seemed to have more understanding and love than those within the church.
- 2. Relate a time when rejection turned into something positive for you.
- 3. How might you miss or reject the goods Gods sends each day?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you recognized Jesus in those around you. What did they do or say to help you see Jesus?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Little Mary, the daughter of a radio announcer, was invited to a friend's house for dinner. The hostess asked if Mary would honor them by saying grace. Delighted, the little girl cleared her throat, looked at her wristwatch and said, "This food, friends, is coming to you through the courtesy of Almighty God."

Children are more the imitators doing what the parents do rather than what the parents say. Deeds speak louder than words.

Today's Gospel invites us to be a people of deeds, not of mere words. We are the children of God who speak what God does and does what God speaks. There is no division in God's will, speech and deeds. The more we practice this non-divisiveness in our will, speech and deeds, the closer we come to experience God realistically. **Our real weakness is not failure to do good and the temptation to do evil.** Our weakness consists in being divided between our word and deed. Though we wish to do good things we easily give up our will to do it. The same way, though we hate to do bad things we yield to our desire and end up doing them. If only we can integrate our word (thought and speech) and deed to be persons of one will, we will begin to experience ourselves as persons created in the image of God who is ONE/UNDIVIDED in Will, Speech and Deed. Let us pray for the un-divisive heart, honest words, un-hypocritical actions to be person of integration.

The month of October begins another important phase of our Parish Golden Jubilee celebration--our, Church renovation. The main church will remain closed during the work of the renovation. We will have our Sunday and daily Masses in the Kirwin and Walden Halls. We have to go through some inconvenience during these three months of construction. But as we know, change and growth always precede with inconvenience. We are a growing church for the last 50 years. Now let us allow God to build us, not only the physical structure but also the spiritual reality of being Christ's Church in each of us. Let us live through this spiritual time of growing towards something New and Godly in each of us.

We will continue to do all the spiritual activities as we did in the main church. Hall-church will not deprive us of any spiritual fruits during this time of renovation in the main church. All activities will go on and all sacraments will be administered and celebrated.

Our Finance Campaign is at its last phase. We are short of just \$190, 000 to reach the one million dollar goal. Just as in a running race, the runner summons up all his strength at the last leg to finish the race, so also at this point, whatever amount small or large you give will put us over the goal faster. People have given from \$100 to \$40,000. Our campaign has been conducted on the basis of equal sacrifice, not equal giving. So I kindly request those who are still considering giving, to please make a donation.



Supreme Court to Hear Baker's Religious Freedom Case:

The Supreme Court will rule next year on whether government may coerce Christians, Jews, and Muslims to use their creative gifts to celebrate same-sex marriage. It will review the case of baker, Jack Phillips, of Masterpiece Bakeshop, CO, who cites his Christian faith in declining to create a custom cake for a same-sex wedding.

"I will serve anyone who comes in," Phillips said. However, designing a same-sex wedding cake would cross a line for him. "I shouldn't be forced to create a cake that goes against my faith."

Alliance Defending Freedom are asking the justices to rule on whether Colorado's public accommodations law, forcing Phillips to use his artistic skills in a way that violates his conscience and sincere Christian beliefs about marriage, violates the free speech or free exercise of religion clauses of the Constitution's First Amendment.

"Tolerance should be a two-way street," said an ADF attorney. "The First Amendment protects Jack's right to create artistic expression that is consistent with his core convictions."

In a totally opposite ruling than for the Phillip's case, in 2015 the Colorado Civil Rights Division ruled that another CO baker did **not** discriminate against a Christian by refusing to make two cakes in the shape of a bible with scripture passages and imagery that the baker interpreted to be anti-gay.




