# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 15, 2017 Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 25:6-10a Psalm 23:1-3a, 3b-4, 5, 6 Philippians 4: 12-14, 19-20 Matthew 22:1-14

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew: Jesus again in reply spoke to the chief priests and elders of the people in parables, saying,

"The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son. He dispatched his servants to summon the invited guests to the feast, but they refused to come.

A second time he sent other servants, saying,

'Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast."'

Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city.

Then he said to his servants, 'The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find.'

The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to meet the guests, he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. The king said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?'

But he was reduced to silence.

Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen."

#### Focus questions:

1.Relate an incident when you were underdressed or overdressed for a special occasion. How did you feel?

2. Describe a time when you made up excuses not to attend a function you were invited to.

3. Describe a way people in the Church made you feel part of the community.

# FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

**Did you hear about a man** who counted his money in front of the mirror so he wouldn't cheat himself? Every one of us has an in-built mirror, called conscience which we cannot cheat any time by any means. It is our witness, guide, judge and cheerleader. It has no fear to tell us who we are and what we do. If we can adhere to its soft voice it will make us shine as an image of God.

**Today's Gospel story describes** how the tenants turn a deaf ear to the voice of their conscience in order to possess the vineyard by killing its owner. The vineyard was leased to them to pay its fruit to the owner. But they wanted to possess it in order to enjoy all its fruits for themselves. When Jesus asked the audience 'what will the owner of the vineyard do to those tenants when he comes?', they reply 'he will put the wretched man to wretched death...' They clearly know from their inner voice that they are only tenants.

**Our conscience, like theirs, informs us always** that we are tenants and not owners. We bear fruits and not claim ownership to exploit our resources/life as we like. If we live by the soft voice of the conscience our life will be one of bearing fruits, fertile and fruitful. If we silence the conscience and try to dominate it with our own wild and rude desires we will end up in 'wretched death' as today's Gospel says. Let us pray for sensitive ears to hear the soft voice of the conscience, God's in-built mirror in each one of us.

**October is the month of Respect for Life.** We pray and promote life at all its stages... from conception to grave. To understand more fully how to defend and protect human life, we must first consider who we are, at the deepest level. God creates us in his image and likeness, which means we are made to be in loving relationship with him. The essence of our identity and worth, the source of our dignity is that we are loved by God: As St. John Paul II says "We are not the sum of our weaknesses and failures; we are the sum of the Father's love for us and our real capacity to become the image of his Son." May this understanding of our self-identity help us live the God-in-us. May God help us realize this identity in all stages of life.

We have started the renovation work. Let us pray that God may renew both our physical church and us, the spiritual church. Let us pray that all works go smoothly and on time. Thank you for all the volunteers who helped shift things to new church set-up in Kirwin and Walden Hall. Please bear with our inconvenience and offer them to God along with Christ's sacrifice that we will be blessed and renewed with His abundance of grace. **Our Finance Campaign is at its last phase.** Request letters are sent to those parishioners who are still considering to help us reach the goal of one million dollars. We are short of just \$180,000 to reach the goal. As in the running race the runner gathers all his strength at the last leg to finish the race, at this point the little or big whatever you give will put us over the goal faster easily. People have given from \$100 to \$40,000. Our campaign has been conducted on the basis of equal sacrifice, not equal giving. So I kindly request those who are still considering, to give their generous donation.


And did you know? Sound travels 15 times faster through steel than through the air.

### Churches Denied FEMA Disaster Relief in Texas:

Three TX churches damaged by Hurricane Harvey sued the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for access to disaster relief money that churches are denied but nonreligious nonprofits are able to get. FEMA "categorically excludes houses of worship from equal access to disaster relief grants because of their religious status," said the Becket Fund For Religious Liberty who is asking the court to declare FEMA's church exclusion policy unconstitutional.

FEMA used hundreds of churches as shelters, medical centers and distribution centers after the Hurricane. "But their policy has made those same churches ineligible for assistance because their primary use is, by nature, religious," Becket counsel wrote. "Excluding churches and houses of worship from FEMA disaster relief ... risks the federal government violating the constitutional rights of those who are playing an instrumental role in getting Texas back on their feet." "This is a time of crisis for Houston," Becket said. "Churches are some of the helpers. Yet they are denied the same relief other nonprofits are getting from FEMA."

Museums and Zoos are eligible for relief but churches are not. "If the Churches were to cease all religious activity in their houses of worship, those buildings would become assistance-eligible," the lawsuit read. "The Churches are not seeking special treatment; they are seeking a fair shake." (washingtontimes.com, 9/5/17; frontporchnewstexas.com, 9/25/17; freaction.org, 9/22/17)

In a June, 2017 Supreme Court decision that a church in Missouri could get government money to resurface its playground. Chief Justice John Roberts wrote, "The exclusion of Trinity Lutheran from a public benefit for which it is otherwise qualified, solely because it is a church, is odious to our Constitution and cannot stand." We pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet every Wednesday, at 3:00 pm in the Church.


