



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 22, 2017 Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 45:1, 4-6 Psalm 96:1, 3, 4-5, 7-8, 9-10 1 Thessalonians 1:1-5b Matthew 22:15-21

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

The Pharisees went off and plotted how they might entrap Jesus in speech. They sent their disciples to him, with the Herodians, saying,

"Teacher, we know that you are a truthful man and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. And you are not concerned with anyone's opinion, for you do not regard a person's status. Tell us, then, what is your opinion: Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Knowing their malice, Jesus said,

"Why are you testing me, you hypocrites? Show me the coin that pays the census tax."

Then they handed him the Roman coin.

He said to them, "Whose image is this and whose inscription?"

They replied, "Caesar's."

At that he said to them,

"Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

Focus questions:

1. Describe a time when you had trouble doing what you felt your faith asked of you.

2. Relate a time when you put someone/something to the test even though you knew the answer ahead of time.

3. Describe a time when you were caught in a no win situation as Jesus appeared to be. How did you solve your dilemma?

Family and children's question:

St. Thomas More was faced with choosing between being faithful to the Church and loyalty to the king. He chose faithfulness to the Church and it cost him his life. Learn more about St. Thomas More, our patron saint this week.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Wife: You forgot my birthday again . What is your excuse this time?

Husband: How do you expect me to remember your birthday when you never look any older?

Excuses are self-justifications to hide one's own negligence. Excuses may help momentarily to escape from trouble, but in the long run, the person will find out that excuses hindered living our potential.

Today's Gospel story shows how excuses diminish one's opportunity and capacity to live one's life in full. Life is like a wedding dinner. God invites us to savor it free of cost. But like those in the Gospel story we may look at life in our own narrow concerns tied to our business, family or private interests.

Life has a bigger picture than our personal experience of it. Life is not formed by outer forces like wealth, popularity, pleasant situations etc. It blossoms from the formation of inner forces of love, mercy, forgiveness etc. Jesus invites us to come out of our own self-centered excuses and justifications. Life is the experience of the deeper truth than our personal convenient convictions.

If we can open our heart and mind in prayer and scripture-readings, we will be empowered and equipped to see and experience life as a wedding dinner served by God in love, mercy, forgiveness etc. Let us pray that God makes us look at life not as built by our own sweat and toil but as God's invitation to enjoy God's free dinner. Let us celebrate life.

We have started work on our Hall-Church. As one of our parishioners said, "it is a different place... but we are together again." The place does not define us, we define the place by our experiencing the warmth of God's love with one another. If love of God and people become the goal, any place of gathering becomes God's holy church.

Renovation works are progressing at a good pace. The wall has been opened and the beauty of the stainedglass can be seen. Work on the floor has begun. Please pray that all our works of renovation bring our God's glory and renew us as a Spirit-filled community to experience His Love and Mercy in the New Church as new members of fraternal love.

I will try to include pictures of the renovation works periodically, showing how we progress towards something NEW to happen for us in and thorough God's Grace.

We Welcome Msgr. Richard Henning, our Vicar to celebrate and pray with us this Sunday at the 12:15 mass. His presence and prayers will be an added blessing in this Golden Jubilee Year of our Parish.

Did you know that more than 50% of the people in the world have never made or received a phone call?



Court Rules Against Football Coach Silent Prayer:

In August, a 3-judge panel of the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals, struck down the appeal of Washington State H.S. football coach, Joe Kennedy, who was fired for taking-aknee on the 50-yard line after a game, bowing his head to silently thank God for a good game, and 30 seconds later leave.

Judge Milan Smith wrote, "By kneeling and praying on the 50-yard line immediately after games while in view of students and parents, Kennedy was sending a message about what he values as a coach, what the District considers appropriate behavior, and what students should believe, or how they should behave."

Even though students were not required to pray with him, in 2015 the Bremerton School District issued a directive that forbade Kennedy from exercising his faith in any way that would be visible to students. The directive included anything from praying to wearing a religious icon.

"Think about where that leads," said First Liberty counsel, Jeremy Dys. "That means the Muslim teacher could not wear her hijab, the Jewish teacher couldn't wear his yarmulka, and the Catholic teacher couldn't wear her crucifix."

"Banning all coaches from praying individually in public just because they can be seen is wrong," said First Liberty President Shackelford. "This is not the America contemplated by our Constitution." (dailycaller.com,8/23/17; latimes.com, 8/23/17; breakingchristiannews.com, 8/24/17)


