### Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 5, 2017 Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Malachi 1:146-2:2b, 8-10 Psalm 131:1,2,3 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9,13 Matthew 23:1-12

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saving, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers. Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be vour servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted "

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Mother: Now remember to put some of your allowance in the offering at church.

Son: Why not buy an ice cream cone with it and let the cashier put in the offering?

Love is an offering, not a justification of what one wants to do. As Paul explains in his first letter to the Corinthians (I Cor. 13: 5) "Love does not insist on its own way." Love renders service; it does not establish its right. Mothers Teresa explains: When we criticize others we will have less time to love them.

**In the first reading God exhorts His people not to** forget how God was compassionate to liberate them from Egypt. So God reminds them to be consciously compassionate to other people. In the Gospel Jesus repeats the same duty: the love of God and love of people as the first of the commandments. It is not merely a commandment to be known but a life line which indicates if one is alive or dead. In loving others we begin to experience God, who is the life force among us. Without loving others, the love of God remains as the dead letter of the law. Love of God is alive only where the love of the other lives. Let us love others to live the love of God. Let us love God to live in love with others.

Wednesday October 18<sup>th</sup>, stones bearing our family names were laid at the base where the New Tabernacle will be set. Now we have laid stones at the base of the Tabernacle where the Eucharistic presence will be reposed. By our stones we express our living faith that we are the Spiritual House of God in whom the Sacrifice and the presence of the Eucharistic Lord come alive in our everyday life.

**The Renovation work is progressing well.** Concrete has been poured over the extended portion of the Sanctuary. Duct work and the carpentry works are going on. Please continue to pray that all may go well and that we may celebrate Christmas in the Renovated church.

**Halloween - November 1<sup>st</sup> All Saints.** The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the <u>Christian</u> holy day of <u>All Hallows' Day</u> (also known as *All Saints', Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. October 31<sup>st</sup> Eve of All Hallows in popular use became *Halloween*. When we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November first, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve (October 31<sup>st</sup>) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil only to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saints Mass with our Costumes on November 1<sup>st</sup>: In the background of what I explained above, teens and adults are invited with Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Wednesday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

**November 2<sup>nd</sup> All Souls Day--** At 7:00 pm is the memorial mass for all those who passed and were buried from our Church during the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the relevant families informing them of this Mass. Please feel free to join us to pray for all those deceased from our families.

We thank the Golf committee for their selfless service over a period of six months. They raised over \$ 17,000 this year. In the name of the parish I congratulate them and am grateful for their tireless efforts and team work in making the Golf outing fun-filled and such a great success.



### Ban on Farmers Over Their Marriage Views is Overturned

A federal judge ruled in mid-September that the Catholic Michigan farmers who were banned from selling their produce at a farmers market because of their religious beliefs about marriage, may resume selling their goods. East Lansing officials had banned the farmers from participating in the 2017 Farmers Market, (even though this farm had sold their organic fruits there for 7 years), when they learned the farm would resume hosting weddings for unions between "one man and one woman."

"Our faith and beliefs on marriage and hosting weddings at our home in our backyard of our farm have nothing to do with the city of East Lansing," said Farmer Steve Tennes. "Nor does it have anything to do with the produce that we sell to the people that attend the farmers markets who are from all backgrounds and all beliefs."

"My wife Bridget and I volunteered to serve our country in the military to protect freedom," Tennes said, "and that is why we feel we have to fight for freedom now whether its Muslims', Jews', or Christians' right to believe and live out their beliefs." "The government shouldn't be treating some people worse than others because they have different thoughts and ideas."

"All Steve wants to do is sell his food to anyone who wants to buy it, but the city isn't letting him," said Alliance Defending Freedom in June. "People of faith should be free to live and work according to their deeply held beliefs without fear of losing their livelihood. If the government can shut down a family farmer just because of the religious views he expresses on Facebook - by denying him a license to do business and serve fresh produce to all people - then no American is free."
