



Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

Dentist: Good grief! You've got the biggest cavity I've ever seen – the biggest cavity I've ever seen. Patient: You don't have to repeat it, doc! Dentist: I didn't – that was the echo. Our life is an echo of what we believe. Our words and actions reverberate our faith.

Today's Gospel is a double miracle – one intertwined into the other. It starts with Jarius inviting Jesus to his home to heal his dying daughter. As Jesus was walking towards his home, he came amidst the pressing crowd, and this woman who was suffering from hemorrhages for 12 years, believing that she would be healed by touching his garment. She was healed as she believed. Jesus complimented her, "Daughter, your faith has saved you."

In the meantime, the news arrives from Jarius' home that the daughter died. At this news Jesus encouraged them, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." Later at the home, Jesus silenced those ridiculed him and raised the dead child. Both the stories of today's Gospel narrate how Jesus connected the miracle with faith.

Though the first miracle of healing happened in a very personal and unknown way at the woman's act of secretly touching the fringe of Jesus's garment, Jesus acknowledged outwardly and aloud that it is her faith that healed her. "Daughter, your faith has saved you." In the second miracle, Jesus instructed the people to hold on to their faith even though the daughter had died already. A miracle is the moment that reveals what God can do and how faith is necessary for God to allow the miracle to happen.

Faith is our inner personal forum where we allow God to act. Both Jarius and the woman had very discouraging and despairing life-situations, but both stayed in the course of faith. The woman tried for 12 years various means of healing and spent all the money. Faith took her to a level that humans could not. She believed that she would be healed, and it happened. Jarius continued to believe even when the odds were against him. He continued to believe in Jesus though his own people discouraged him saying "Your daughter has died; why trouble the teacher any longer?" Rather he decided not to lose faith in Jesus. He adhered to Jesus' words, "Do not be afraid; just have faith." His faith in Jesus brought his daughter back to life.

Faith keeps us going strong even when the odds are against

us. Faith fills us with the knowledge and a new consciousness to expect what God alone can do in the midst of what humans cannot do. Our life becomes an echo of what we believe. May God fill us with the gift of faith in Jesus. May our faith in Jesus open our hearts to Jesus to work in and through us. May all we do or say be touched by the power of our faith in Jesus.





As a parish, we would like to make you aware of our ability to bring the Eucharist to our parishioners who are unable to attend Mass. It is a privilege and responsibility that we do so. We ask that you call the rectory to request Communion in the home.

Please note that if you or a loved one is in need of Communion to be brought to the home, we must adhere to the following guidelines, for the safety of both the recipient and our Eucharistic Ministers:

If anyone in the home is suffering from a contagious illness, we are unable to enter the home.

There must be a companion with the recipient to ensure the safety of your loved one and our EM. Have you been called by Name?
