



#### John 6:60-69 (Ordinary 21)

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said, "This saying is hard; who can accept it?" Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them, "Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe." Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve, "Do you also want to leave?" Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

#### Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

A doctor was called in to treat a grumpy patient. "Well, sir, what's the matter?" he asked cheerfully.

"That is for you to find out." The patient snapped.

"I see," said the doctor. "Well, if you'll excuse me a minute. I'll phone a friend of mine – a veterinarian. He's the only man I know who can make a diagnosis without asking any questions." Wisdom bends down to help. Rigidity is too proud to accept it.

This Sunday's readings proclaim the invitation of Wisdom to the banquet of life. Whoever is not snobbish but humble will hear its invitation and cherish life. Whoever willingly accepts Wisdom's invitation, will live forever. Life is available to us to the extent that we open ourselves to Wisdom. We reap what we sow in life. If we accept Wisdom in faith, we will reap the fruits of Wisdom in life.

In the Gospel, Jesus the Living Wisdom of God invites us to believe in him, that He is the banquet of Life that God offers to us humans. He offers himself as the food and drink which nourishes us not only for this earthly life but also for eternal life. We become what we eat. Thus, we would become Jesus-like by eating Jesus-the food.

We are created by God in His own image. Now God's own Son Jesus offers himself His food to nurture God's image in us. In the celebration of the Mass, we recall and re-enact the Last Supper. We re-celebrate his living presence in the form of bread and wine, the Eucharist. Thus, in every Mass, Jesus sets for us His banquet. We are nourished by His very self, in the form of food.

The food we eat gets assimilated into our very being. May the divine food of Jesus get assimilated into us. Then, with St. Paul we too can realistically say, "I live, no longer I, but Christ lives in me; insofar as I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who has loved me and given himself up for me." Let us be nourished by the Eucharist, the body and blood of Jesus in the form of bread and wine.


Deacon Matt is especially interested in hearing the voices of the young. So teenagers and young adults are most certainly encouraged to get a group together!






