#### Luke 3:1-6 (Advent 2)

In the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea, and Herod was tetrarch of Galilee, and his brother Philip tetrarch of the region of Ituraea and Trachonitis, and Lysanias was tetrarch of Abilene, during the high priesthood of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John the son of Zechariah in the desert. John went throughout the whole region of the Jordan, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the words of the prophet Isaiah: A voice of one crying out in the desert: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths. Every valley shall be filled and every mountain and hill shall be made low. The winding roads shall be made straight,

and the rough ways made smooth, and all flesh shall see the salvation of God."

Focus Questions for Advent 2 Luke 3:1-6

1: What are the obstacles that get in the way of you seeing God's action in your life? 2: John proclaimed a gospel of repentance and forgiveness. How do you live that out? 3: How are you preparations going this Advent?

Family & Children's Question: What are some things you are doing this Advent to help those in need?

#### Fr. Antony's Letter

Dear Friends,

"The Lord created the world in six days and rested on the seventh. On the eight-day God started to answer complaints." These words picturesquely describe how even God's creation would not be free from criticism if we choose to see only faults and defects. We begin the Season of Advent this weekend. It encourages us to look at everything and every person in God's light...not to complain about the darkness but to kindle God's light in us.

**On this first Sunday of Advent,** we will bless the Advent Wreath and light the first candle. The lit advent Candle symbolizes our preparation to receive the light, Jesus Christ in our hearts and home. Not that we are worthy to receive him, but Jesus is voluntarily coming to us, to enlighten our darkness.

The four candles of the Advent Wreath represent the four weeks of preparation. Each candle represents a different gift which God is ready to fill our hearts with —love, hope, joy, and peace. By lighting a candle each week, we increase the brightness of the light to fill our heart with these virtues. As we get closer to Christmas, the birth of Christ, the increase of light with the number of candles symbolically makes us aware that the divine light comes close to us, and we grow more ardent to be illuminated by Christ the light. The Advent Wreath encourages us all to get rid of the darkness by coming closer to Christ, the Light. Let us rise and shine. Rising and shining are the only remedies and antidotes to complaining and doing nothing about darkness.

**God did not treat us unworthily of receiving Jesus**, His Son, but He sent Him to make us worthy. He sent Jesus as Light rather than complaining about the darkness we were in. Let us take this time of Advent to trim the wick so our lamps burn brightly. God has not abandoned us for our unworthiness, but found ourselves as his worthy place to be born. Let us welcome Christ our Light. Let us awaken to our worth to shine brightly.

This week's Gospel encourages us to treat the troubling and discouraging moments as a time of opportunity to work for relief and restoration. "When these signs begin to happen, stand erect and raise your heads because your redemption is at hand." In these words of Jesus, we are invited to handle all our moments (both good and bad) as signs of God coming closer to us. He warns us not to be carried away by the stress and burden of the moments. He instructs us to "be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man." Let us enter the season of Advent to live in hope and with confidence that God is coming closer to us, to walk us through all kinds of situations.

The first Sunday of the Advent there will be new missalettes in the pews, with all the readings, hymns, and prayers for the whole year. Since they are to be used for the whole year, until end of November 2025, I request that you please handle them gently. After use, please place the missalettes carefully in the racks. Please do not jam books into the racks in the open position. Before leaving the church, please check your pew to see that the missalettes are in order. Thanks for your cooperation.



## Saints of December



St Ambrose Feast Day: December 7th Bishop of Milan Patron: Beekeepers

Governor and theologian, strong promoter of Roman Christianity against Arianism & paganism. Swarm of bees landed on his face as an infant, leaving him unharmed. Helped convert St Augustine to Christianity. Authored four hymns known as the Ambrosian hymns.



Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast Day: December 12th Empress of the Americas, Patroness of Latin America, Queen of Mexico

Title for the Blessed Mother Mary, associated with five apparitions to Juan Diego and Juan Bernardino, Mexican peasants in 1531. The Basilica of OLG is the most visited Catholic shrine in the world.

St Lucy Feast Day: December 13th Virgin & Martyr Patron: The Blind

From a wealthy Roman family, received a vision of St Agatha promising her mother would be healed of illness. Used opportunity to distribute riches to the poor. Her betrothed disagreed and had her sentenced to a brothel. She was martyred in their attempt to take her to her punishment.



St John of the Cross Feast Day: December 14th Priest, Mystic, Doctor of the Church Patron: Spanish Poets

Carmelite friar, very involved in the Counter-Reformation in Spain. Studied under and was mentored by Teresa of Avila (St Teresa of Jesus). Prolific writer known for his poetry and writings on the development of the soul. Considered one of the greatest authors of Spanish literature.



The First Martyr "The Promartyr" Patron: Altar Servers

Mentioned in Acts of the Apostles (Acts 6), he was a deacon in the early Church in Jerusalem. Angered members of various synagogues with his teachings. Accused of blasphemy and was stoned to death.





St John the Apostle Feast Day: December 27th Apostle Patron: Love, loyalty

Generally regarded as the youngest apostle, brother of James, son of Zebedee. Believed to be the only apostle to die of natural causes. Traditionally held to be the author of the Gospel of John, Johannine epistles, and the Book of Revelation. Potentially the "disciple whom Jesus loved".
