#### Gospel of John (17:20-26)

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying:
"Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who
will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be
one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be
in us, that the world may believe that you sent me.

And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you

sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also

may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me,

because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me.

I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in





#### From the Pastor

Son: "Dad, what is a religious traitor?"

Father: "A person who leaves our church and joins another."

Son: "And what is a person who leaves another church and joins ours."

Father: "A convert, son, a convert."

A convert or a traitor is a matter of allegiance, what one shows to a particular group or not. God is not bound by any allegiance.

God is in and beyond every group and all denominations with Godly abundance.

Today's readings invite us to see this Godly reality amidst all of us. The first reading narrates how the early church recognized that the spirit of the Risen Jesus exists and works in both groups of Jewish and Non-Jewish (Gentile) Christian Churches. The second reading portrays how Heaven, the Godly abode is New Jerusalem without a Temple. Humanly speaking, the Holy City of Jerusalem, without a Temple is unthinkable. But divinely speaking, the temple is wherever the spirit and presence of the Risen Jesus presents. Heaven does not need a Temple because it is the presence of God everywhere in all the places forever.

The Gospel explains this truth in an emphatic way that God's presence is available in Jesus to whoever loves and keeps His word. God's presence is not a privilege of a particular group of people or restricted to a particular building or place. Whenever we pray or worship God, God begins His experience with us in particular symbols and places. But he always leads us to His abundance which no creed of a particular group, culture, liturgy, or symbols can hold or express fully.

In worship we don't bind God to our limitations but allow ourselves to expand to His limitless abundance. Let us pray to God to break all the barriers each of us have built in the name of religion, culture, ideologies etc. We are invited in worship and life, to experience and live the PEACE Jesus has given to us. The Risen Jesus presents among us, His believers, as the abiding peace among us whenever we are gathered to worship Him. Jesus gathers us and encourages us to live His peace and allow it to be available to all through us.






# Reflections on the 2025 DRVC Eucharistic Pilgrimage & Congress





# Ascension Thursday

Ascension Thursday, a Holy Day of Obligation, commemorates the ascension of Jesus Christ to the right hand of the Father 40 days after the Resurrection! This year we celebrate this Feast Day on Thursday, May 29th 2023.

St. Augustine's work appears to be the first written evidence of the observance of the feast day on Ascension Thursday, although he traces its origin to the apostles. John Chrysostom, Gregory of Nyssa, and the Constitution of the Apostles also make reference to the feast.





#### **Council Scholarship Application**

Who is eligible? All current graduating high school seniors who are members of the St. Thomas More Parish
